This is done by providing housing units for the aged with recreational facilities which encourages mixing with young adults. The elderly are provided counseling services which are designed to train and not to foster dependency. The cost of the program is paid through a social security system which taxes the young adults rather heavily during their productive years so that every opportunity can be provided for them to live in dignity after age 65.

Al Bergesen (Mr. Albert G.) presented an informative and entertaining address anent the trials and frustrations of the U.S. Customs Bureau in enforcing the nation's narcotic smuggling laws. There are plenty of "cops and robbers" aspects involved, but Mr. Bergesen left no doubt about the serious, indeed, tragic nature of the problem of drug addiction and abuse. There are many international implications, with deep involvement of organized crime.

The speaker stated that conservative estimates indicate 250,000 addicts in the U.S. today, with many needing upward of \$100 a day to appease their habit.

The Bureau is in the process of being "beefed up" with the addition of some 2000 personnel and the acquisition of one of the most sophisticated communication systems in existence. The value of apprehended heroin alone in fiscal 1971 would have more than paid the entire Bureau budget, had the "stuff" been sold on the street.

The inspection for apprehension of contraband narcotics is incredibly difficult, involving more than 200 million persons a year, according to Mr. Bergesen.

The 3000,000 odd Chinese are not particularly welcome but are too economically powerful to be removed.

The country was dominated by the French between 1863-1953. Many French influences are evident. Of the numberous rubber plantations which once flourished, few remain. Approximately 75% of the land area is virgin jungle. Per capita annual income is about \$75, but there are presently more than 1200 industrial enterprises, up from less than 100 in 1953. The country is rich in natural resources which were not indicated. Diplomatic relations with U.S. have been somewhat sporadic. In their desire to be free and independent. The Cambodians have, so far, failed.

- -- Past Pres. Jim Fitzgerald introduced eight guests from Los Altos, Mountain View, Burlingame, San Carlos, and Menlo Park.
- --Don Helbush introduced 3 guests, Sid Berlin,4. Finemaster -- Lee Borges. Whew!

- -- San Francisco's State Senator George Moscone gave an excellent critique on the problems of education in California. After a few introductory remarks about the general tax picture in the State (a chaotic situation) the Senator warmed to his subject in impressive fashion:
 - In grades Kindergarten thru 12, the State faces an ever-worsening fiscal crisis. Once a leader in its educational committment, we have dropped from 6th to 24th place among the states in expenditures per pupil, and from 12th to 18th in percent of income spent on education at this level. In average class size we rank close to Alabama, in 42nd place. The Senator considers that the prospect for increased percentage of State support is dim.
 - 2. During the past five years especially have experienced a serious erosion of public confidence. If criticism is indicated for this grim state of affairs, all groups are culpable: students, teachers parents, public -- and legislators. There are several bills in the hopper, but lack of public confidence is the second great problem in public elementary and secondary education.
 - Higher education: follows the same general pattern as the other two levels, viz money and confidence. The situation is further complicated by the confusion and frustration in which it is enveloped. Whereas California had the most outstanding higher education system in the U.S. in 1960, this is no longer the case. Senator Moscone is no more optimistic of an early reversal of the trend in higher education than he is about the lower levels. If this is correct and we agree with him the educational process deals with our most important asset, the prospect is grim indeed. He made an impassioned plea for public leadership.

Specifically, he performs breathalizer test to determine if people are intoxicated. Even though we often consider the topic in jest, Jim brought out some very serious statistics. According to Mr. Brackett 2/3 of the deadly automobile accidents are created by drunk drivers and Alcohol is quite a deadly poison when misused and often causes death or physical impairment. Mr. Brackett stated that a person who has an alcoholic content of .10 in his blood is considered to be legally intoxicated. State law stipulates that a driver suspected of drunkeness must submit to either a blood, urine or breathalizer test. The breathalizer test is the easiest to perform and is now considered a reasonably accurate method of measuring the amount of alcohol in a persons blood stream. In conclusion, Ray Winther submitted himself to the test, breathed in the tube and had a reading of .09 on the breathalizer scale.

Last Week -- Bill Bulanti introduced Vic Slaven who is a member of the American Insurance Association, which is comprised of 110 publicly owned insurance companies. Mr. Slaven was an advocate of no fault insurance and presented a very convincing case for the no fault concept. In a nutshell, the pure no fault automobile insurance concept would be compulsory for all automobile owners and would protect the insured against all economic loss incurred as result of an accident. This would include unlimited medical expense, all wage loss, death benefits for dependents, survivor benefits and coverage of pedestrians and passengers. Mr. Slaven said that for this coverage, individual insurance premiums would be reduced approximately 30%. At the present time .21¢ of the premium dollar goes for lawyers and .23¢ of the premium dollar is allocated to pay for pain and suffering suits. Under the no fault concept of insurance, pain and suffering would not be considered a cause for payment, no person could be sued and all benefits would be paid without consideration to fault.

From that point Lang has been involved in improving the situation for athletes at the College level.

The insights he gave us about the negotiations, inequities, and general problems associated with the Athletic Scholarship program were eye openers to us who have separated professional sports from collegiate athletics.

LAST WEEK -- Don Helbush introduced Mrs. Lillian Blackford, statistician for the San Mateo County Public Health Department, who spoke about her studies of drug abuse among youth of the County.

Mrs. Blackford stated that her studies showed that between 1955 and 1965 there were only 45 juneviles referred to as hard drug users. In 1966 alone there were 157 drug offenders. Because of the dramatic increase a survey was begun in order to assess more accurately the scope of the drug abuse problem. Mrs. Blackford related how for the past four years she has conducted and refined a very comprehensive study about drug use among junior and senior high students. In general, her studies indicated that even though it appeared that the use of hard drugs have leveled off, the most recent study shows that the use of all drugs as on the increase and that there has been a decided increase in the use of hard drugs and alcohol among young people.

Vietnam and is of the opinion that the war has had no direct effect on her life. So. Vietnam has a population of 66 million, and 'the countrymen" are tired of the war; The government is not popular with the people because it doesn't do much for them. Obviously from an upper-middle class family, Thuy speaks French fluently, although it is no longer the official language. Youth--especially girls--are expected to study hard, learn to be good mothers, and to obey their fathers!
 - -- Carl Middlemann from Capetown, So. Africa told of his 1 year obligation for national service (universal for whites) half of which he has fulfilled. When he returns he will complete the obligation and continue his studies in the University of Capetown. Carl's description of apartheid was interesting to say the least. He graduated from a 650 student all-white all-boys' school, K-12. Uniforms are worn and the curriculum he described as "narrow." The four groups comprising the 21 million population of South Africa are whites (4 million); blacks (14 million); colored (2 million); and Asians. Approximately 87% of the world's gold production comes from South Africa.



January 4, 1972

THIS WEEK -- Some Students from the Sequoia High School Occupational Training Project will be present to give a progress report on the new program. Russ Kent, program chairman for the month will introduce the speakers.

Finemaster is Jim Greenwell.

NEXT WEEK -- Al Attles the Coach of the Golden State Warriors will be at our meeting to bring us up-to-date on the basketball team.

The money extractor will be Stof Stofles.

LAST WEEK -- Jim Green well began the meeting with a song. There were twelve visiting Rotarians and among those visiting we were fortunate to have Dave Evans from Batesville, Arkansas, John Smale from Chico and Past District Governor, Ray Winther.

Jack Berrett was Finemaster for the day and worked a variety of techniques for extrating fines. It was a job well done.

Paul Keckley introduced Jim Fales as the speaker for the day. Jim, who is the City Manager for Redwood City, gave a report of his first 100 days (give or take a few) as the Administrative Officer for the Council and explained the priorities for action which he has defined for our City. Essentially, he stated that he has moved through a needs assessment program and as part of a long range program plans to:

- 1. Complete a reorganization study in order to assess methods of organization which would help our City Government to become even more efficient.
- Develop a management by objectives program for the City Government as used in industry.
- 3. Continue to increase communication between various departments and to diversify management skills through training programs.
- 4. Develop budgets for the City on basis of program goals and priority allocations as established by the Community, Council and Administration.
- 5. Developing Capital improvement budget on long range basis.

Some of the immediate programs on which the City will be working are:

- 1. Revitalizing the Central Business District.
- 2. Feasibility studies for developing Redwood Shores.
- 3. Assesing new methods for financing utilities in Redwood Shore Area.
- 4. The Fair Oaks Community Center, and its scope of operation.
- 5. Funding the mini-bus system through new State monies.
- 6. Looking at Housing needs for Redwood City.
- 7. Development of the harbor as a recreational and industrial center.

Also a short film documenting the first NYPUM program at the Northeast YMCA of Los Angeles will be shown.

The speakers were counselors from local high schools who have been involved in the Occupational Training programs in which some Rotarians have served as advisors and participants. The program is designed to offer instruction, guidance and work experience to high school students so that they may get a "feel" for a job prior to entering an Occupation. The students in the program are trained in the classroom, are often provided with individualized simulation activities related to their interests, and then are given practice in the actual occupations they have chosen. Many business and professional men provide on the job experiences to students. high schools --- Sequoia, Menlo-Atherton, Ravenswood --have placement officers who help place students who have been through the program. Information about opportunities in vocational areas are provided in a Career Information Centers in each of the High Schools in the area.

It is planned to have some students who have been through the program at the last meeting in this month.

LAST WEEK'S SPEAKER -- William Bennett was the speaker for last week. Mr. Bennett who is an elected member of the State Board of Equalization, an Attorney, Professor of Law, and a Consumer Spokesman discussed the growing problem of large monopolies. Mr. Bennett said that the national philosophy was never meant to have the wealth cornered by only a few. Yet, in recent years politicians and bureaucrats have often conspired to allow companies to merge even when the merger would stifle competition and work to the detriment of the consumer. Mr. Bennett illustrated his point by describing a merger case on which he worked. He adeptly described the political machinations that occurred in a case where one natural gas company was attempting to absorb its competitors and control the natural gas industry in the Western United States. Even though the merger was in violation of Anti-trust laws, the Government supported the merger. He said the Government must remove political interests from its deliberations in anti-trust suits and must firmly uphold the law in prosecuting violations.



He is sharply critical of the Seniority system as it presently operates in Congress, and equally critical of various policies and acts of the Nixon administration. Vietnamization is essentially a failure but the outcome of the present conflict is not clear.

Economic policies of the Administration have resulted in a series of unsatisfactory results: inflation continues to be a threat budget deficits of 24, 40 billions respectively for the past 2 years, continued high employment, unused plant capacity, accelerated concentration of corporate assets in the hands of fewer and fewer.

In answer to a question McCloskey stated that resistance to the seniority system is a non-partisan effort, sparked by young members. J.R.B.

From the D.G.: Senior Active Classification

The principle advantages of Senior Active Memberships are: It gives active members an opportunity to make a personal contribution to their club's membership by opening a classification. It provides the club an opportunity to secure a younger and more energetic member.

It recognizes the status of older, more experienced members by offering them special advantages.

An Active member who automatically becomes or exercises his option to become a Senior Active member, may move to any other location and continue his membership in his original club indefinitely so long as he fulfills his attendance requirements or he may choose to transfer his membership to that club (one such move). His business or professional status is in no way affected by this new membership. Upon attaining the age of 65 or 5 or more years of cumulative membership, such Senior Active member may be excused from attendance requirements. Under certain circumstances Senior Active members under age 65 may enjoy the same privilege for a specific period of time. The Senior Active member should not lose his identity because his badge should show in addition to "Senior Active" his Former Classification and he should be identified as such. (Ed. note: There are presently 17 Sr. Active members in R.C.Rotary.)



About the scope of the councilmen's duties. The mayor described the various coordinating activities in which the city is involved at the local, regional, State and national levels. The names of these coordinating committees are too numerous to mention, but Paul made it clear that each council member has little spare time because of committee participation. The complexity of government and the interrelationship of problems between the various governmental levels require over lapping coordinating committees and a broad base of citizen participation. Mayor Keckley also explained that a city council member is the politician most accountable to the public since he operates more closely to the taxpayer than any other elected official. In spite of the taxpayers protest, Paul reminded us that all of the city's services are provided for a cost of only .40¢ a day per person.
