Today will feature the second of our series on the medical malpractice crisis, this time from the lawyer's point of view.

Our Finemaster is Bob Dooley who may have a hard time trying to duplicate the money collected last week but he will Bob along and Doo it.

/LAST WEEK/

Jim Greenwell at the piano led us in song, Jack Estes led us in the pledge of allegiance, and Bob Friebertshauser gave the invocation.

Amongst our members was Jim Fitzgerald, fresh from a 2½ month tour of England, Europe, and Canada including 13,450 miles by car.

Dave Schutz gave the news, Les Riddell as Finemaster took out the Old Redwoodcity Rotary Club Roster Book and from the information contained in its pages raised money from everyone.

Our speaker was Dr. Alvin Nantanson a representative on the California Physicians Crisis Committee from San Mateo County speaking on the medical malpractice crisis for the Doctors. He indicated that the doctors have many divergent views on how to approach the problem. He emphasized the tremendous number of suits, that there are many good doctors in San Mateo County, and that the carelessness doctor is not the cause of the problem. He indicated that the new rates for malpractice insurance will triple (e.g. anathesia from \$5,000.00 to \$16,500.00, orthopedic from \$5,000.00 to \$21,500.00, and surgical up to \$15,000.00, all per annum figures). The Doctors prefer not to pass on the increased cost to their patients and the result will be to force some senior Doctors to retire. Doctors need assistance in deciding how to solve the problem, and Nantanson said that even if legislation is enacted it won't change the insurance premium increase. In Medical, the fees are fixed and many hospitals will have to close. In short, medicine is in trouble.

LAST WEEK

Last Monday, July 28th, we had a joint meeting with the Belmont Rotary Club at the Holiday Inn, with President Elect Bob Durkin presiding in the absence of President Bill Bergler.

Robust singing with Jim Greenwell at the piano and Sid Berlin with the Baton began the meeting, followed by the pledge of allegiance led by Jack Keller, and the invocation by George Bold.

President Rudy Helin from the Belmont Club took care of fining the Belmont Rotarians, and Tony Goodsite of our Club took care of fining our members by the use of his astrology chart.

Dave Schutz in his inimitable style gave us "What's New."

Our speaker was Alister McAlister, Assemblyman from San Jose and ~~co-author of pending legislation relative to malpractice to conclude our three part series on the malpractice crisis.~~ He said that four factors contributing to the problem are (1) Inflation in medical care costs (2) The development of impersonal physician - patient relationships (3) The advancement and improvement of medical technology and (4) The rising expectations about what doctors can do.

McAlister said that the current pending legislation (AB 1 of the 2nd Extra Session of the Current Legislature) is designed to do the following: (1) In the legal field to reduce and more clearly define the statute of limitations applicable to malpractice actions, to reduce double recoveries, to authorize periodic payments of any judgment by the trial judge, and to provide a formula for contingent attorneys fees. (2) In the field of quality of care to beef up the Board of Medical Examiners and to require recertification of doctors every so often. (3) In the field of insurance to require the Insurance Commissioner to review increases in malpractice insurance rates over 10%. He said that insurance companies have consistently underestimated their risks and cannot predict their liabilities with accuracy.

Our speaker today is Miles Smith, Life President of the Insurance Informational Institute, according to our program director for the month Henry Ritter, and the subject will be "Malpractice - the Insurance Viewpoint."

Our finemaster is Walt Small who will prove he is no Tiny Tim when it comes to raising money for the Club.

LAST WEEK

Orv Graves led us in song, Bob Waligore led us in the pledge and our ex-officio minister Vince Claypool gave the invocation. Dave Schutz gave the news and then proceeded to levy the fines as finemaster. Joe Mell gave a report on the Senior Citizen's Project (\$25,000 - \$40,000 seat money needed for engineering and consulting fees, considering optioning land until studies completed, and Board of Directors will meet with consultants).

Our speaker was Nino Lo Schiavo from the Sheriff's Office who whose subject was organized crime and militant disidents. Organized crime now operates with pen and pencil and many of the militant disidents use explosives. Principal activities are bookmaking (of which 2 Billion Dollars per year is used to attempt to corrupt the criminal process), loansharking (loaning money at 20%-25% interest per week), labor racketeering (by the use of union pension funds), and others. Nino said it will take years to win the fight against organized crime and we are losing the battle right now. The militant disidents are making and storing explosives and you can even make one out of fertilizer and oil. The bomber doesn't see his victim and has a purpose to carry out; the pattern these days is to call and take credit for the bombing after it occurs rather than calling ahead of time.

The meeting adjourned with a minute of silence in memory of Jack Rognas who passed away last week.

Garth also showed a film of the recent U.S. - Russian flight and the docking of the U.S. Appolo and the Russian space vehicle, as well as the experiences of the Russian cosmonauts and the U.S. astronauts. Among other things studies were conducted of the sun, the measuring of energy and the identification of the sources of energy in the galaxy. Future flights in 1979 will feature space ships of DC - 9 size, the placing of a large space shuttle system and an outer space telescope, and all of this technology will help us learn more about the earth as well as more about the universe.

There will be increased expenditures for investment and services to provide more equality of life. International trends will be taken into account and it is critical to U.S. Industry and agriculture that other nations pull themselves out. Inflation will continue and for quality of life there will be health programs etc. as well as environment and housing receiving priorities which will contribute to inflation. Interest rates will be back up and will be higher the next five years because of needs of government, corporations and individuals to borrow. To grow and progress and to solve energy and urban problems we must expect inflation and interest rate increases.

Sid Berlin with Jim Greenwell at the piano led us in song, Jack Ference led us in the pledge of allegiance, and Bob Friebertshauser gave the invocation. Dick Chilingarian introduced Doug Ryan as our student guest for the last time and he expressed his appreciation for attending Rotary.

Bill Bulanti donated the prize for the raffle, and Bob Durkin made use of our Club History in his chores as finemaster, after Dave Schutz had given the news. Don Helbush announced three basketball trips on January 8, February 12 and March 23, 1975.

Our speaker was Lem Summey, C.C.D.A. of San Mateo County, who indicated that only 10 other counties besides ours have the District Attorney performing the functions of a County Counsel - general practice of law in the public sector advising County officers, boards and commissions, and special districts including school districts. In San Mateo County the civil side of the District Attorney's office consists of 13 attorneys who advise the Board of Supervisors, 34 County departments, 26 County Boards and Commissions, 60 special districts and 25 school districts. Major areas with which his office is involved are (1) Land use planning such as the development of San Bruno Mountain, zoning, land acquisition for public use, agricultural preserves and open space, and environmental impact reports. (2) Insurance because of the fact that \$100,000.00 of the recovery in governmental liability tort cases is not covered so that his office must handle tort cases (3) School problems such as pupil discipline, teacher dismissals, etc. (4) Taxes - tax assessment appeals board hearings where property owners object to the assessments on their real property and (5) Probates and guardianships which are cases for the Public Administrator and Public Guardian respectively. Lem said that in the last 3 years the Family support division has netted over 5 Million Dollars for the County Treasury and the probate fees have averaged \$50,000 per year for the last three years. Notable cases handled by his office include the Bayside Timber case where the former Forrest Practices Act was ruled unconstitutional and the Westbay case involving a dispute as to title of much of the land in the San Francisco Bay.

LAST WEEK

With Jim Greenwell at the Piano Orv Graves led us in song, Chuck Long led the pledge of allegiance, and Bill Bulanti gave the invocation. Chuck Long was back with us after a year's absence because of a heart attack and Orv Graves was back with us after his accident which kept him out for several weeks. Lem Summey gave the news, and Dick Chilingarian again introduced our student guests from Sequoia High, Brenda Lewis and Chris Clark. Jack Ference as finemaster used Astrological forecasts, among other things, to raise money for the Club. Les Reese donated the door prize for the drawing.

Bob Pierce introduced our speaker, our own Tom Poore on the Epidemiology of Cancer, who covered three main areas, who gets cancer, who gets what cancer, and why do they get cancer. 85%-90% of cancers come from external causes e.g. cancer of the skin is caused by the sun. If our white corpuscles don't kill the cancer the cancer kills us. Basically a cancer cell is a mutation with no more function in our body. Tom said that 5%-6% of all women in the U.S. have cancer of the breast and that factors are (1) a family history of same (2) Age 40-49 the most likely (3) More likely if late first pregnancy (4) the higher the social economic status the more likely (5) Religion - jewish girls twice as much as catholics (6) Blood group - before menopause more likely in group O, after menopause more likely in group A. Japanese girls seldom get cancer of the breast and Jewish girls seldom get cancer of the cervix. Cancer of the colon is most frequent in sophisticated North America. 60% of the cancer of the stomach cases have disappeared in the U.S., but in Japan the death rate from cancer of the stomach is 8 times that of the U.S. Cancer of the prostate is 3 times as common in married men who have children as in married men who don't have children. There have been significant improvements in the treatment of cancer and some cancers appear to be virus connected.

Sid Berlin led the singing and Paul Keckley gave the invocation. Hal Hjertberg brought us up to date on the news.

Jim Williams as finemaster gave a break to a "bunch of losers - 20 to be exact" by picking some "losing" raffle ticket numbers and making them fine exempt.

Our speaker was Bob Outman who made an interesting presentation on animal psychology, or how to think like your pet does. Bob has had extensive experience in dog handling with the San Mateo County Sheriff's Dept. and his dog is one of the highest rated dogs in the country.

Some highlights of his presentation:

The dog was one of the first domesticated animals. Humans in general know very little about how dogs "think". The dog looks upon the family that cares for him as his "pack" and will select the dominant figure as the "pack leader". Obedience training involves the establishment of a rapport between the dog and the owner. This rapport makes possible behavioral modification.

When used in police work the dog is an extension of the policeman, i.e. sense of smell, hearing and sight. It was cited that the dogs extraordinary sense of smell, which for example makes it possible for a trained dog to detect several grains of gun powder left in a desk drawer overnight, is needed for survival in the wild.

The dogs hearing range is much higher than the human - typically 55,000 Hz verses about 15,000 Hz humans.

When training a dog for police or guard type work, the objective is to bring out the leadership traits i.e. make him the "pack leader". This can be done by continually praising and petting him.

Dave Schutz made an announcement about the community wide appreciation dinner planned in honor of Max Gerfen for his service as director of Sequoia Hospital. The dinner will be held at the Elks Club on January 15, 1976.

Today, our speaker is Dave Mendel who will speak on the topic, "Aid to Victims and Witnesses".

Our finemaster is Lloyd Osborne who will no doubt constructively add to the treasury.

/LAST WEEK/

Sid Berlin led the singing, George Chaffee gave the invocation, and Dave Schutz brought us up to date on the news. Charlie Gyselbrecht as the finemaster noted that several had been observed the previous week in various poses of inattention, and fined them accordingly.

Our Speaker was Don Froll on the subject, "The Employed Alcoholic". Don works with the National Council on Alcoholism (NCA) which was founded in 1944, and is funded in part by County, State and Federal Funds. Don's services are available to private industry for the initiation of programs to aid those whose performance is impaired by the improper use of alcohol.

The statistics as to the cost of alcoholism to industry are alarming - an estimated 25 billion dollars per year. Standard Oil of California reported alcoholic related losses at 5 million dollars per year, and through NCA instituted programs, was able to reduce losses by 1 million dollars.

Seventy-five percent of all single car accidents are caused by drunken drivers - 225,000 persons are arrested for drunk driving each year in Calif. alone.

Alcohol is a drug - alcoholism is a disease having long term adverse affect on the heart, pancreas, liver, etc.

Twelve percent of employed persons have sufficient problem with alcohol to adversely affect their work - 8% of work force are alcoholics. Of 287,000 employees living in San Mateo County, 5% are alcoholic. Absenteeism is a predominate loss attributed to alcoholism - typically Mondays, Fridays, and days before and after Holidays. Fifteen percent of the people in this country buy 75% of the liquor.

Dave Schutz announced availability of tickets to the community wide dinner to be held in honor of Max Gerfen. Max retired in December after many years of service as Director of Sequoia Hospital. The dinner will be held at The Elk's Club on January 15th, 1976. Today is the last day tickets will be available.

Direct services to victims include medical and vocational rehabilitation benefits from the State. Services to witnesses include giving them advance notice of when and where to testify, explanations of what is going on, and getting the witness home when he finishes in court. Hopefully the benefits of the program will be that more victims will report crimes, more witnesses will come forward, and the criminal system will be more meaningful. The crimes covered under the program in addition to murder include armed robbery, assault, forceable rape, crimes against children, and miscellaneous ones such as victims of hit and run and drunk driving.

David Schutz gave the news and Jim Parmelee substituted as finemaster for George Bold. The door prize was donated by Ed Hussong of Wells Fargo and won by a visiting Rotarian as usual. Jerry Schutz reported our bowling team is in 4th place and dropped 3 out of 4 games. Walt Small read a letter from Leslie Scroggins and Bob Webster from Woodside High, our last week's speakers, thanking us for the Club's donation to their pledge of allegiance project. Bill Wenrich, President of Canada College gave his icebreaker talk (he is originally from Big Rapids, Michigan).

Walt Small introduced our speakers Ray Lunney II and III (# 3 is a junior lightweight with a 24 win 2 - 3 record) and we received a demonstration on how the hands are bandaged and taped for boxing. First a spray lotion is applied which causes the tape to stick better. Gauze on top of the knuckles is allowed in training but not in the actual fight. Gauze is used on the rear of the hand to support it. Fighters must be checked in by 7:00 P.M. on the night of the fight and the main event cannot start after 10:00 P.M. Adrenalin chloride is the basic ingredient for treating cuts. Training for the fight consists of an average of 2 miles roadwork, shadow boxing, then boxing a maximum of 5-6 rounds, then work at the punching bags, more shadow boxing, situps, then relaxation and a shower. Ray's pre fight meal consists of 2 chocolate milkshakes and 1/2 dozen pancakes after weigh in; the night before is the last time he takes liquid before the weigh in. Fights are arranged by the promoters contacting the managers.

President Bill announced that the next Board of Directors' meeting will be on Thursday, February 26, at 12:00 Noon at the Holiday Inn.

The District Assembly will be Saturday, May 22, 1976 at the Royal Coach Motor Hotel, 1770 South Bayshore Blvd., San Mateo The District Conference will be held in Eureka on May 6-8 so make your plans accordingly.

Our speaker is George Pickett, Director of Public Health and Welfare of the County of San Mateo. Our finemaster is Walt Koslosky who will parlay his knowledge of getting income from real estate toward getting part of our income into the Club treasury.

Orv Graves with Jim Greenwell at the piano led us in song, Charlie Gyselbrecht led us in the pledge, and Bob Friebertshauser gave the invocation. Fran Pearson donated the door prize, Lem Summey gave the news, and Pres. Elect. Bob Durkin presided over the ceremonies until our friendly undertaker, Pres. Bill, arrived. Finemaster George Chaffey, among other things, proved that none of our governing board members (including P.E. Bob, Pres. Bill and P.P. Joe) know their own weight (George claims the scales he used were accurate). Bill Maxwell introduced student guests for their first time Jan Bliele and Victor Bustos (from Sequoia High, Natch).

Our speaker, Father Edward J. Murphy, the head of the California Jesuit Missionaries, told us about the 27 years he spent in China (he volunteered to go to China in 1937, spent 2 years in Peiking learning Mandarin, then went to Shanghai—was there when war broke out between Japan and China and spent from 1943 till then end of the war in a concentration camp, then to Nanking for 6 years the last 2 of which were under Chinese communist rule until he was exiled from China and sent to Taiwan where he spent 13 years. In China although all words are written the same there are 17 dialects and he had to learn 2000 Chinese characters (out of 40,000) over a 2 year period. He learned how to speak Mandarin dialect and then had to learn Cantonese. He was most impressed with the Chinese culture (it goes back 5000 years) and the Chinese student's love for learning and respect for his teacher. He also mentioned the lack of discipline in the U.S. as compared with Communist China, and advocated more discipline in the U.S. but from reason, not from fear.

A long discussion was had concerning the nomination of Dr. Wolfgang Wick for President of Rotary International because of the fact that he belonged to the Austrian Nazi party and served in the Waffen SS, the Nazis' elite army corps during World War II. The Club voted unanimously to send a letter to the Secretary of Rotary International with copies to the Director of Zone 1 and the District Governor of 513 expressing our concern and asking for information to find out what the thinking of the nominating committee was on the subject (the nomination is for R.I. President for 1977-1978).

The door prize was donated by Bob Durkin.

Our speaker was Dr. George Pickett, Director of Public Health and Welfare on the subject of Health Care. Some of the objects of the 1974 Planning Health Law passed by Congress are (1) Making sure underserved people have equal access to primary care (2) Developing nation wide systems for integrated health care and (3) Improving the quality of health care as economically as possible. He said that controlling the cost or amount of health care or both requires public regulation because if the consumer makes the decision the cost will skyrocket and if the provider makes the decision the results will be inequitable e.g. preference of the medical profession to treat private patients rather than Medicare patients. One solution for equity is to make all medical costs the same as in England. The use of Physician assistants to improve the quality of care at lower cost requires changes in education, licensing and malpractice laws.

NEWS IN BRIEF

At the Board of Directors meeting after last week's club meeting Bob Durkin was named President for the coming year and Dave Schricker was named President Elect. Vince Claypool was excused from regular attendance because he is senior active and over 65. Glen Struckman was dropped from the club.

Attendance for February was 92.81% a big improvement over last year's 90.10%.

Joe Mell introduced our speakers, Dr. David L. Fischer and David Trujillo and Mr. Trujillo spoke in opposition to Proposition 15 (the anti-nuclear measure). He said the passage of the measure would rule out nuclear power in California because the three conditions required for its continuance could not be met: (1) removal of the liability limit of utilities for damages from use of nuclear power (2) the California legislature must find that there are no hazards from permanent waste disposal and (3) the legislature by 2/3 vote approve continued use of nuclear power. He said the arguments against the passage of Proposition 15 are that nuclear power is needed to generate electricity, particularly in California, there is a safe method for disposal of nuclear wastes, nuclear reactors are safe and have proven so, and other sources of power would be more costly and the wastes from other sources would be harder to dispose of.

LAST WEEK

We had a special meeting honoring the 30th anniversary of our Club with our Rotary Annes present. After song led by Sid Berlin, the pledge of allegiance led by Bill Maxwell, and the invocation given by Lloyd Gebhardt, we got down to serious business. (Our Club was chartered April 22, 1946).

Hal Hjertberg gave the news as it was in an April, 1946 issue of the Redwood City Tribune. Jack Keller as finemaster collected \$2 from everyone who didn't have a smoke detector in his house. The door prize was donated by Stan Silverstein.

Three of our four charter members Bob Brown, Dave Schutz and Paul Jones were present. Bill Enomoto presented President Bill Bergler a silver urn (full of flowers) in honor of the 30th which he had received from Ray Winther in honor of the 25th (Anniversary of our Club).

Dave Schutz covered the period from April, 1946 to April 1960 - he said it was peaceful (so far as world conflict) except for Korea, it was pre-television, and prosperous; he recalled the Rotary milkshake concession at the 4th of July Rodeo, Ray Wilson and the trust his widow set up for Rotary Scholarships, and the previous meeting places of the club (Sports Club, Nipa Hut, Algiers, and Mels Bowl, before our present meeting place).

Alan Bostwick covered the 1960s, recalling that during this period Tom Poore started the International Seed Program project, our Club collected 5000 books for the Nehru library in India, we sponsored an orphan in the S O S Kinderdorf in Austria (and still do), and many of our Rotarians worked on the improvement of the Y M C A camp, Camp Carlsberg, and the Boy Scout Camp Ed Barrer. Alan also recalled Ed Stubbe as Santa Claus, Lyle Edson being separated from his canoe, Dave Schtuz being the only newscaster, and Bob Biggs being invited to be song leader at Rotary International in 1969.

Bill Enomoto covering the 1970s recalled the Easter collection jars for crippled children, the Salvation Army Bells, and various Rotary trips he had taken: to Japan with Clyde Crippen, to Australia and New Zealand with Vince Claypool and other Rotary trips of real benefit.

The Midpeninsula Park District is doing this and has acquired 3000 acres since it was first formed three years ago by means of a property tax (maximum 10¢ per \$100 assessed valuation without a vote of the people to increase it). Other sources of revenue are grants, borrowing sources, and gifts and the proposition on the ballot is whether a portion of San Mateo County should be annexed to the district. The main costs of the district under the board of directors' present policy is 80% of its budget for land acquisition. The thrust is not to stop city development but to direct it elsewhere he said, because in many cases developments in the foothills result in development which doesn't carry its own way.

Jim Williams was presented a plaque from the Redwood City Chamber of Commerce for his services as a Redwood City Council member by Bill Stangel.
