Registration cost for the Assembly is \$12.00 per Rotarian. Wives or other guests will be \$5.00 for the luncheon.

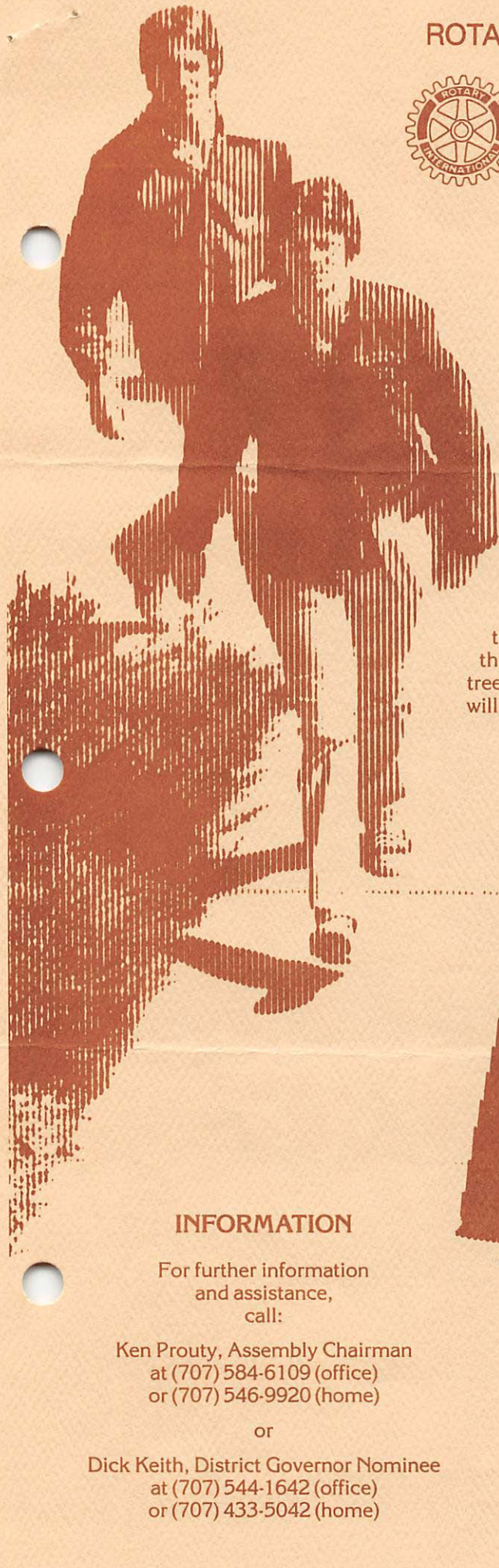

Our District is stronger because he served, and for this we say thank you Bob and Jeanne. 



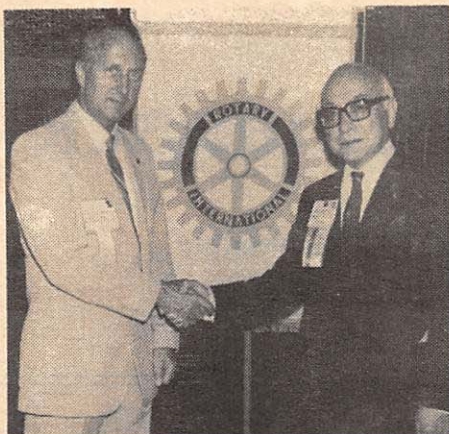

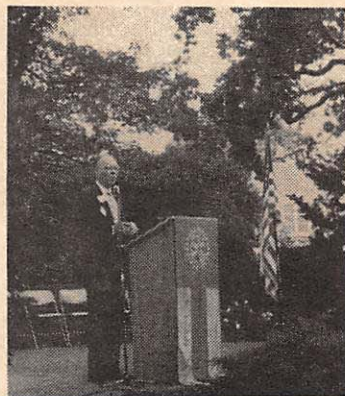
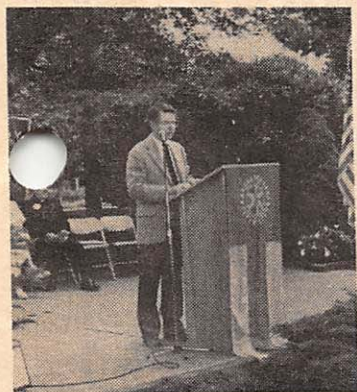

# Sayings Of The Governor

While writing the article about the outstanding presentation made by International Director Mike Kutsuris at the President-Secretary meeting, my thoughts turned to the land of Greece and the outstanding contributions this relatively small country has had upon the world.

Greece has provided us with some of the greatest thinkers known to man, and it has been said that Socrates was the first great Greek Apostle of human relatedness.

In his book, "Hope for Man," Joshua Loth Liebman reminds us of Socrates and his contributions to the world. He said that Socrates taught us that the purpose of life is to attain, not fame, not money, not reputation, but rather the improvement of the inner life, the achievement of character.

Socrates asked, "What is the purpose of all the wondrous show of suns and planets in the universe if it did not make possible the happiness of one human being?"

Socrates did not care about the starry pathways and secrets of matter. He cared only about the welfare of the human being; and he believed that welfare could be attained only if men searched themselves, if they came to realize that vice is only ignorance and virtue is knowledge, and that if a person really studied his life situation, he would not come to sin willfully.

Socrates truly believed that "Mankind is One" and he taught us that men cannot live in isolation from their fellow men, and that we are bound together almost organically just as the hand and the foot and other parts of the human body are bound together one with another. No human organ can exist alone and live, and no man can exist alone, spiritually, ethically, morally and live.

He said if we human beings would learn the true art of measurement, we would learn to renounce the short term pleasures for the long term peace of mind. ❀

### Thanks to Rotary, A Filipino Boy Is Happy To Eat

A team of medical specialists from California, U.S.A., led by Dr. Wilson J. Turbey, a Rotarian surgeon, has reconstructed the face of Victor, a five-year-old Filipino boy born with a rare congenital jaw deformity. This humanitarian project was co-sponsored by the Rotary Clubs of Encino, California, U.S.A., and Las Pinas, Manila, the Philippines with travel and recuperation costs paid for by Rotary Foundation Special Grant.

Six doctors donated their services to correct Victor's cleft jaw, which was similar to, but much rarer than, a cleft palate. The anomaly occurred when the boy's lower lip and jaw failed to grow together normally. As a result, the halves of his jaw worked independently and food flowed from a hole in his chin.

"It really necessitated his living with a bib on constantly," said Dr. Turbey.

During the surgery, two of Victor's ribs were grafted to his jaw, and skin grafts were used to build up his lip. A dental splint was also installed to support the jaw until the bone graft grew solid.

The Encino Rotarians decided to help Victor early in 1981 after learning about his affliction from an employee of the restaurant where the boy's father also worked and where their club met. Victor's parents could not afford to bring him to the U.S.A. for treatment. So the Encino and Las Pinas Rotary Clubs applied for a Special Grant that enabled Victor and his mother to fly to California for the operation.

Said Dr. Turbey: "I'm so thankful that so many people were so generous in providing everything needed to help Victor." ❀



## Meet Al Wilmore, Area 6 Representative

This independent consulting work has been associated with SYSTAN, Inc., from Los Altos, California, and involves research work associated with preparing state and local governments for disaster, both nuclear and natural. He has authored and co-authored five research reports/studies. He has also served as Vice Chairman of a Committee developing an earthquake response plan for the State of California (known as the Governor's Earthquake Task Force). For the past three years, he has served as a public member of the Sonoma County Disaster Council.

Al moved to Santa Rosa in 1963, and joined the Santa Rosa Rotary Club in 1972. He has been on the Board of Directors of that club, and is also a Past President.

As you can see, Al has had a very busy and productive life, and he has what it takes to make an outstanding Area Representative. ❀

# Nominations Requested For District Governor For 1984-1985

Art Agnew, P.D.G., Chairman of the Nominating Committee, is requesting clubs to submit to his Committee the names of any qualified men who would be interested in being the District Governor for the year 1984-85.

The qualifications for the position as outlined in the Manual of Procedure are as follows:

"The District Governor must be a member, other than honorary member, in good standing of a club in the district by which he is nominated;

must be fully qualified for such membership in the strict application of the provisions therefor and the integrity of his classification must be without question;

must be a qualified member of a functioning Rotary club in good standing which has no outstanding indebtedness to R.I. as of the close of the fiscal year preceding that in which he is proposed as a candidate for nomination for district governor;

must have been a member of one or more Rotary clubs for a total of seven or more years at the time of his taking office as district governor;

must have served as president of a club for a full term;

must be willing and able, physically and otherwise, to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office of district governor as herein provided;

must attend for its full duration, the international assembly immediately preceding his election and return to his district by 1 July, immediately following the close of the international assembly. It is highly desirable that he attend the international convention;

should possess the esteem and confidence of his own club;

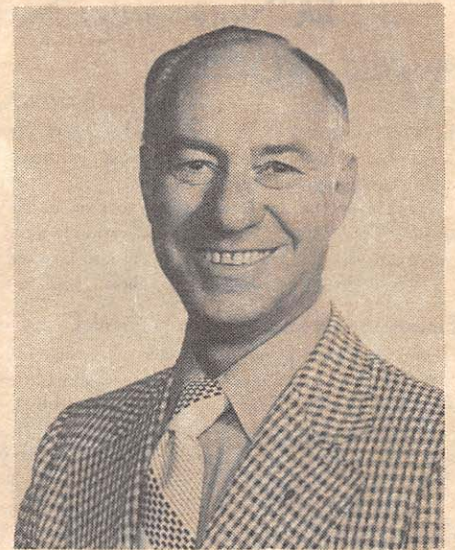
should be a man of high business or professional standing, with executive ability, demonstrated in the conduct of his own business or profession;

should have his business or professional work so well organized that he can give the time necessary to carry out his Rotary work;

should be a man whose conduct and the conduct of whose immediate family is above reproach;

should have a knowledge of Rotary, its purposes, object, and laws, and be a Rotarian of recognized loyalty to Rotary International;

should be able to discuss any phase of Rotary in a convincing manner, and to express his thoughts publicly, as well as privately, in simple, direct, and earnest language. He need not be an orator." ❀

## Reflections of a Foundation Scholar

The opportunity to study for one year as a Rotary Foundation Fellow in Canterbury, England, was a personal, academic, and cultural education—much of it unexpected. I didn't expect life in England to be so different from that of the Press Democrat reporter that I left behind in Santa Rosa. After all, they do speak the same language—after a fashion.

But going from newsroom deadlines to studying English literature in the rolling hills bordering a walled medieval city was quite a transition. The fellowship offered the luxury of being able to study for pleasure rather than out of necessity.

I was forced to think of myself as an American, something I had never bothered to define until surrounded by a different culture. True, Americans were often those loud people on trains bruising the Englishman's understated sensibilities. Still, as Americans they had certain expectations. One is that those trains wouldn't go on strike three times in nine months. Or that terrorist bombs do not go off periodically. Or that when things do go wrong, it is not accepted with resignation.

Cultural generalizations are tempting, and often wrong, in their simplicity. All Americans are not outgoing and generous any more than all Englishmen are reserved. But there are differences and one of the most amusing to American students was the subtle



inquiries about our backgrounds by English professors unable to discern our "class" by our accents.

Perhaps the most unexpected aspect of the year was the welcome given Rotary Fellows. Other scholarships do not offer the personal connection of Rotary. From the moment I stepped off the plane and was greeted by an English Rotarian, it was a nonstop series of invitations to speak, to come to dinner, to meet the family, to go to the theater or to share a holiday meal.

During the year, I had a ringside seat for the Pope's visit to Canterbury, saw Prince Charles, and had dinner with the Archbishop of Canterbury. But any understanding of England comes from the hours spent in the homes of English Rotarians. The warmth and hospitality make "World Understanding and Peace Through Rotary" more than a slogan and have given me lifelong friends. I am grateful for the opportunity. ❧

# Sayings Of The Governor

During a recent meeting with Hiroji Mukasa, President of Rotary International, I was introduced to Gerald G. Jampolsky, M.D., who, like Hiroji, is a psychiatrist that is dedicated to world peace.

Dr. Jampolsky has edited a beautiful new book entitled Children As Teachers of Peace. This book is a compilation of drawings and sayings of young children invited to express their thoughts and advice about peace, and I'd like to quote some thoughts expressed by these young people.

"Peace is something you don't see much of anymore.

"To me, peace is something to honor or else you might lose it. The things that go with peace are very important too. Things like trust, respect, love, and honor. These things are a necessity if you want to get, or keep peace.

"In my opinion most people want peace, but aren't sure how to get it. And most of our treaties aren't doing much. In the Falklands we signed a treaty saying we'll give arms to certain countries (among them Argentina and Britain). When two of those countries go to war, we are in trouble. No matter what our choice is, we get an eternal enemy.

"Peace is something to cherish. But you must be careful with it. If you don't pretty soon there won't be anyone to make peace with."

In Jack's monthly communiques he will furnish information, provide answers to questions raised by any of your Foundation Scholarships Committee chairmen, and provide ideas and sample press releases in case you want to use them in promotion of the programs.

The members of the Scholarships Committee were pretty well spread out around the District, so if any Committee Chairman needs help or information more immediately than they can get it from Jack, please phone the committee member nearest you.

Within this territory of each of our 54 clubs is one or more outstanding young men or women who should be considered for an award. Any club that has not been accustomed to submitting one or two nominees each year should do so this year, and get started on the search and selection now. ✎

## Inter-Country Committee Workshop to Be Held in France

The Sixth Annual Workshop for American and French Language Teachers will take place at the beautiful Chateau de Lafayette between July 3 and 23, 1983. The objective of the workshop is the improvement of the spoken language, and enhancing the knowledge of contemporary life in each of the two countries.

The participants will be ten American teachers of French currently employed in a high school, and ten French teachers of English with a master's or bachelor's degree who are currently employed in the advanced classes of a French secondary school. Men and women within the ages of 25 to 45 qualify. The Americans teach the French one day, and the French teach the Americans the next day. One single language is spoken by the entire group each day—one day English, the next day French.

At the conclusion of the workshop, the American participants may stay three weeks without cost with French families, and the French participants with American families in the U.S.

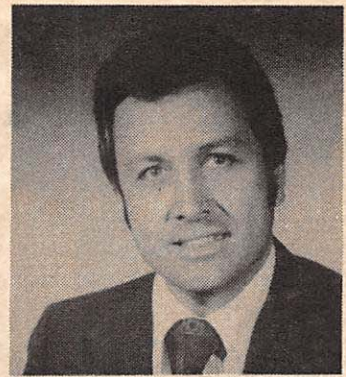

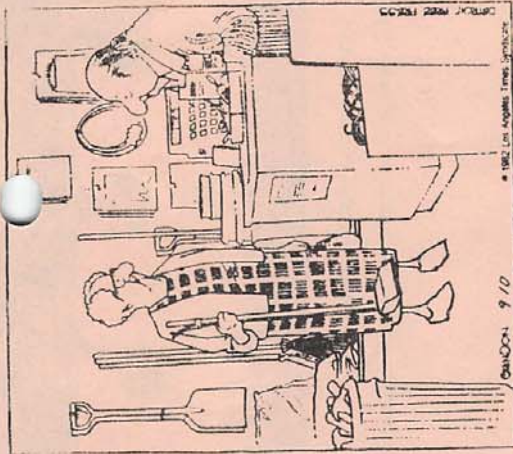

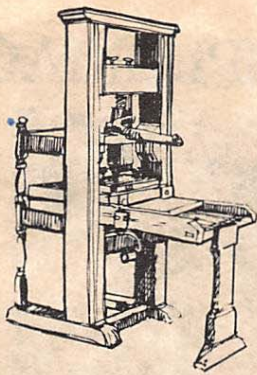

Warm, gracious and hospitable are the words used most often by the members of the 1982 Group Study Exchange Team to describe the peoples of England.

For six whirlwind weeks, between September 1 and October 9, 1982, the Group Study Exchange Team, funded through a grant from the Rotary Foundation, had the "once-in-a-lifetime" opportunity to be hosted by Governor Paul Gaunt and the fellow Rotarians of District 122. Situated in the East Midlands of England ranging 130 to 160 miles north of London and westerly from the East Coast of the North Sea some 70 miles, District 122 is comprised of the villages, towns, and cities of Derby, Nottingham, South Humberside, and Lincoln shires.

From arrival at London's Heathrow airport on September 2 to departure by train from Retford on October 9th the team, supported through the combined efforts of 29

district clubs and countless dedicated Rotarians, was embarked on a zealous program of activities immersing the team into a hands-on approach to understanding the English way of life. As each door was opened, a warm hand of English hospitality was thrust out, openly and honestly.

During the visit each team member was hosted in the home of nine different Rotarian families; attended at least 15 different Rotary club meetings; participated in the annual District Conference; and traveled over 1,500 miles visiting government, historical, educational, manufacturing, commercial, and agricultural centers.

In addition to its group activities, each team member was afforded a week of individual study allowing for a "first-hand" look into the methods and approaches employed by counterparts in comparative vocational enterprises.

## PAINT BRUSH DIPLOMACY



The Rotary Club of San Bruno has embarked on a project designed to carry out Rotary International President Hiroji Mukasa's theme of "Building Bridges of Friendship Throughout the World."

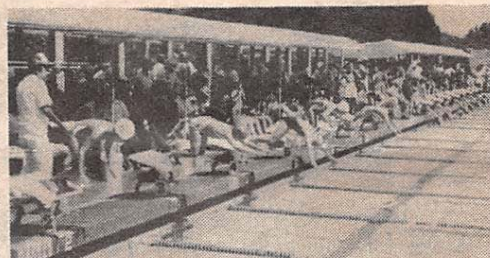
The project, co-sponsored with San Francisco Bay Area artists Char and Rudy Pribuss and called "Paint Brush Diplomacy," calls for an international exchange of children's art—paintings and drawings by students of elementary school age. Each art work depicts a typical day or experience in the life of the artist or some feature of their native land, and carries the name, age, school, city, and country of the young artist.

Participating clubs in foreign countries are responsible for collecting children's art work

from their local schools for shipment to the Rotary Club of San Bruno, which in turn sends U.S. children's art overseas to the participating Rotary clubs. Both here and abroad, the art work is then delivered to local schools and civic buildings for display as a goodwill gesture.

"Paint Brush Diplomacy" has earned positive reaction wherever it has been established and the idea can be shared with others. It seems a most fitting project for Rotary, with a world-wide reputation for promoting world peace and understanding, to join in a global effort, through children figuratively paint a rainbow around the world! ❧

## The 4th Annual Ignacio Rotary Club Swim Classic



The Novato Aquanauts are a sanctioned AAW Swim Team which practices year-round at Novato High School and Indian Valley College. The team is open to girls and boys from 6 to 18 years of age. A year-round, paid coaching staff works with the swimmers, who are divided into groups by ability levels. The Novato Aquanauts are sponsored by the Novato Parks and Recreation Department, and co-sponsored by the Ignacio Rotary Club. This meet began in 1979 and has grown to over 6,000 entrants.

The Ignacio Club's involvement includes moral, financial, and actual participation. A

printed program of events includes donated ads and contributions, which are solicited by all members of the Club. This year, the Ignacio Rotary Club was able to donate \$4,000 out of these proceeds.

The Swim Classic is a very satisfying project, considering the youth that are served. It has also benefitted the Ignacio Rotary Club—several men who have been involved in the meet have become Rotary members. All in all, this is a very gratifying event from the actual participation and fellowship to the financial contributions, which help keep this fine event going each year. ❧

## Ten Foundation Scholars Have Been Sent to District 513: How Will We Receive Them?

More Rotary Scholars are studying in our District this year than ever before. There are ten scholars, two spouses, and three children. All but one is living and studying in San Francisco, but they come from seven different nations—from Korea to Israel. The range of their interests and accomplishments is equally impressive. We have a female Japanese brain surgeon, a graphic design student and a pharmacokineticist from France; two art therapists, one from Israel, the other from Denmark; two medical students from Germany; a civil engineer studying economics from Holland; and from the Far East—a student of English-as-a-Second Language from Japan, and a student of interior design from Korea. All this diversity is difficult to accommodate unless you know what you share in common.

All these students speak excellent English. Furthermore, they have talents and interests in sports—sailing, fishing; in music—we have the potential of forming a small band; in cooking—both their national and our “ethnic American foods”; and in art—its production and appreciation. If you

have any of these skills, you have something in common to share.

Since most of these students are involved in serious research, they—contrary to what we would like to believe—are not all available on call. But all are available on weekends. You have an opportunity to speak with and not just listen to a Rotary Scholar if you invite them to join you at your home, a club social function, or even holiday gatherings. They are here, after all, to build bridges of international understanding in a world where “Mankind is One”—not just to speak at Rotary luncheons.

Finally, if you would like to get more personally involved, consider offering to become a Counselor to a Scholar. By becoming a counselor, you help them to obtain a better insight into our area. The legal and academic problems are covered by their current foreign student advisors on their campuses. Paul Harris Fellows take special note: You have a \$1,000 investment making this program work. Wouldn't you like to follow up on this investment? ✨

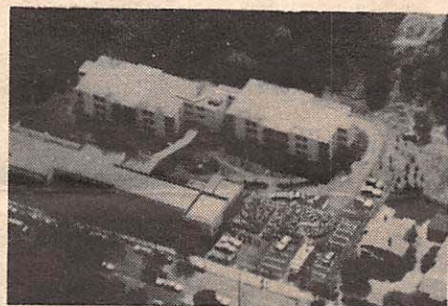
and the neighborhood working together to address a social need. “It is a good example of what can be done when it's done right,” he said, noting the lack of neighborhood opposition to the complex.

## The Miracle of Fifth Avenue— Rotary Manor

San Rafael Rotarians should be bursting their buttons with great pride over Rotary Manor, a handsome apartment complex that is providing affordable housing for many of the community's senior citizens. Club member Jock McNutt, who had a dream of providing affordable housing for San Rafael's inflation-plagued elderly, served as the catalyst for this project, and credits his fellow Rotarians with making Rotary Manor possible. The \$2 million complex was officially dedicated on September 19, after nearly three years of hard work, in which the San Rafael Rotarians donated money, time, labor, and building materials to make this dream possible.

Taking over the abandoned West End School, which the Rotarians were able to buy from the City of San Rafael for \$1, they built a 63-unit apartment complex providing homes for San Rafael residents, ages 62 to 96. These senior citizens will be able to live their lives with the comfort that their rent is not going to exceed \$275 per month. The



complex includes six units specially designed for the handicapped, and each apartment is equipped with a “panic button,” which can alert the other neighbors in case of an emergency.

McNutt and the other Rotarians take pride in the fact that Rotary Manor did not take any government assistance. Unlike most new projects, government funding is not subsidizing the rent.

Mayor Larry Mulryan, who was one of the speakers at the grand opening ceremony, said that Rotary Manor is an example of a cooperative effort of private business, the city,

Jerry Mertens reported that we have been offered a location for a fireworks stand if we were interested. The Board voted 4-3 to proceed with this, with the tie-breaking vote cast by the President.

Phanna Vongsay Dental Needs

George Chaffey reported that two Vongsay children need braces, and that Phanna, who is 15, needed to have the work begun right away. He had a bill for \$88 for xrays and evaluation, and reported on his discussion with Ron Koster regarding the possibility of his donating some services to help. The Board authorized the expenditure of \$88 and appointed a committee of Chaffey, Armstrong, and Mertens to meet with Ron and work out a financial plan that the club might be able to finance. One suggestion was to convert the monthly collection system for the Austrian orphan to a monthly or bi-monthly collection to provide funds for the braces. The Board tentatively approved an expenditure of \$2000 for the braces for both children.

Changes in Redwood City Rotary Club By-Laws

--Adopted by the Board--

1. Revision of Article I, Section 1, as follows:

The Board of Directors shall consist of ~~nine-(9)~~ eleven (11) Directors. The Immediate Past President shall be one of the Directors, and his term shall be for one (1) year. Normally, the other ~~eight-(8)~~ ten (10) Directors shall serve for terms of two (2) years. The terms of ~~four-(4)~~ five (5) of the Directors shall terminate each year, except as provided otherwise in the sentence following. The term as a Director of the President-Elect shall be in any event for one (1) full year after the completion of his service as President-Elect. Nevertheless, at no time shall the total number of Directors exceed ~~nine-(9)~~ eleven (11).

(Note: In implementing this section, it is the intention of the Board to appoint the two new members from the top candidates in the Board election held on February 22. New members would take office on July 1, 1983, one for a one-year term and the other for two years.)

2. Revision of Article X, Section 6, as follows, to require only one signature rather than two, on all checks from the Charitable Foundation Account:

All checks against the funds of the Redwood City Rotary Charitable Foundation shall be signed by any ~~two~~ one of the following officers: Treasurer, President, and President-Elect, after prior approval by the Board of Directors.

(Note: All checks now drawn on the general account require only one signature, so this makes similar provisions for our own foundation account.)

The Board also adopted the following changes in the dues structure, which were reported to the membership previously, but which must be approved by the membership in the same manner as by-law changes:

- 3. The admission fee for new members shall be increased from \$45 to \$50, starting July 1, 1983.
- 4. The annual membership dues for members shall be increased from \$80 to \$100 starting July 1, 1983.
