LAST WEEK To hear President Don Kennedy of Stanford, we went to the hills to Canada College for a very well-attended joint meeting with the Rotary Clubs of Belmont, San Carlos, Redwood Shores and Menlo Park - Food was served in their high-ceilinged Cafeteria (Multi-purpose?) by our own Dorothy. Fines were benevolently cancelled by our Prexy Roy Frank. Wonder Why? The excellent turn-out seemed a wonderful opportunity to re-coup, etc. but maybe it was in the "interest of time"!

At lunch, District Gov's Rep. John Paladino illuminated current R.I. Pres. Ed Cadman's Theme of the Year: YOU ARE THE KEY! with the story of poor Joe, a Rotarian who wasn't appointed to any committees! Why? with the "Saga" concluding with Joe becoming a "Key". (And do can YOU!)

Before 1 pm we moved to the Main Theater to hear Don Kennedy who was introduced by our own educator Bob Stiff. Kennedy's theme was: "Education, how much do we really want it?", with the running thread: "Paying for It" in this day and age. He told us that 1/3 of all Americans get some post-secondary education; 16% get Bachelors Degrees at over 400 institutions, creating a close scrutiny of the economics of Education. "The PRICE of Higher Education is lower than the real COST", 2/3 to 1/2 in most private colleges. Recent changes in public policy, a threat to colleges with high tuition; moves that would end the "Charitable Deduction" and Tax-exempt Bond Financing. Kennedy feels that the proportion of family funds needed for college education hasn't changed, but "families pay more for other things, are squeezed more from other sides of life", and that if students are turned from the private to the public colleges, the burden on the taxpayer will be greater. And much more.

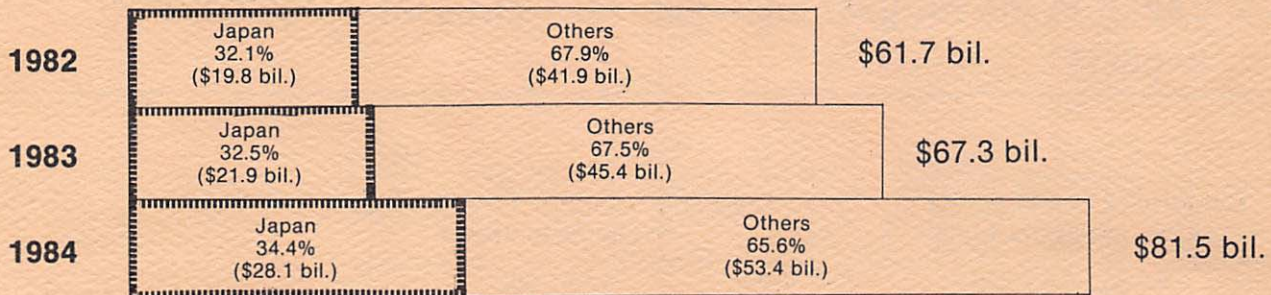

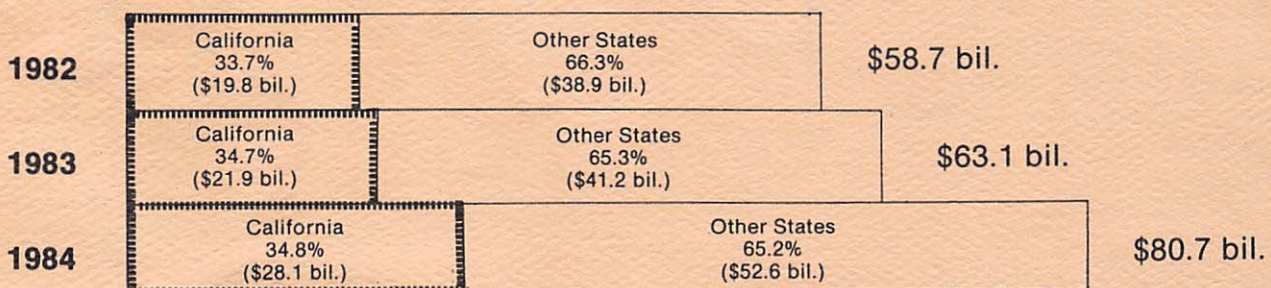
CALIFORNIA'S WORLD TRADE

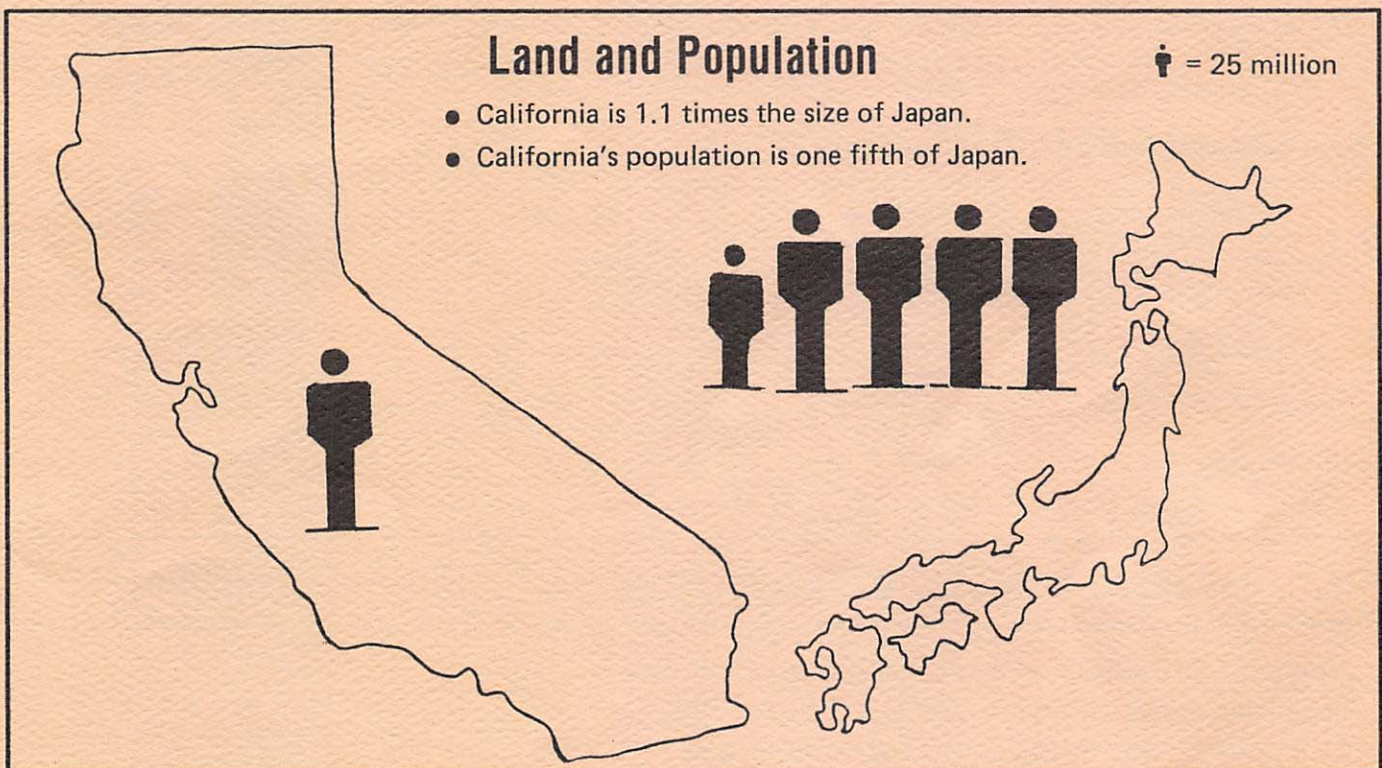

TODAY Our speaker is Ms. Sharon Winston, who is Manager of the Broadway branch of Great Western Savings & Loan. We'll hear of the problems that this industry has been experiencing recently from one intimately involved; why some S & Ls have been in trouble, although some other have not, etc.

Finemaster today should be one Delbert Mitchell--a member since (yes it's true!) March 1955; he should be able to dig up a few bones and hold them up to public gaze!

LAST WEEK Pres. Roy got the meeting going right on time. We were reminded of the Soft Ball Game at Los Prados Field in San Mateo at 10 AM Sat., August 24th (that's at the end of this week!). A practice session today up at Canada College--happy Stevie San Filippo has details.

Much noted was in increase in our meal charge to \$8.00; it's been at \$7 for a long time.

Bob Stiff, the academician, extracted the fines.

General Program Chairman Lem Summey introduced our speaker, Shannon Green, a Rotarian and a Travel Agent from Burlingame, who underwent a Heart Transplant just 4 months ago. Told of his poor outlook from a failing heart-Cardiomyopathy- of long duration, back in Oct. 1984, he was "placed on the list" as a potential recipient at Stanford Medical Center and begun on preparatory medication. He was "summoned" to Stanford on April 14th at 11 pm, and some hours later received his "new" heart at the hands of surgeon Dr. Margaret Allan (the 22nd for her and the 336th at Stanford). On awakening, he says he "felt his heart beating" and was told "that is what all the rest of us feel", etc. He spent 3 weeks and 2 days in the hospital and returned to part-time work 6 weeks later. To prevent "rejection" he is under multiple medications which he estimates will cost \$14,000 per year. We were most impressed by Shannon's grasp of detailed knowledge of his condition and the complexities of this type of surgery and the resultant statistical factors. His appearance and manner gave no inkling that only a few months ago he had undergone one of the world's most advanced and complex surgical procedures. Wonderful!

Did you listen to Pres. Roy Frank's closing remarks? He has something for all of us every week. Listen!

ROTARY R.I. Pres. for '85-"86 Ed Cadman (did you read about him in the ROTARIAN: Orthopedist in Wenatchee, Washington?) says: "YOU ARE THE KEY"-- Each of us is the KEY that can open the door to Rotary for someone new, the way the door was opened for each of us - Do your part to bring new men to Rotary; don't depend on the Membership Committee.





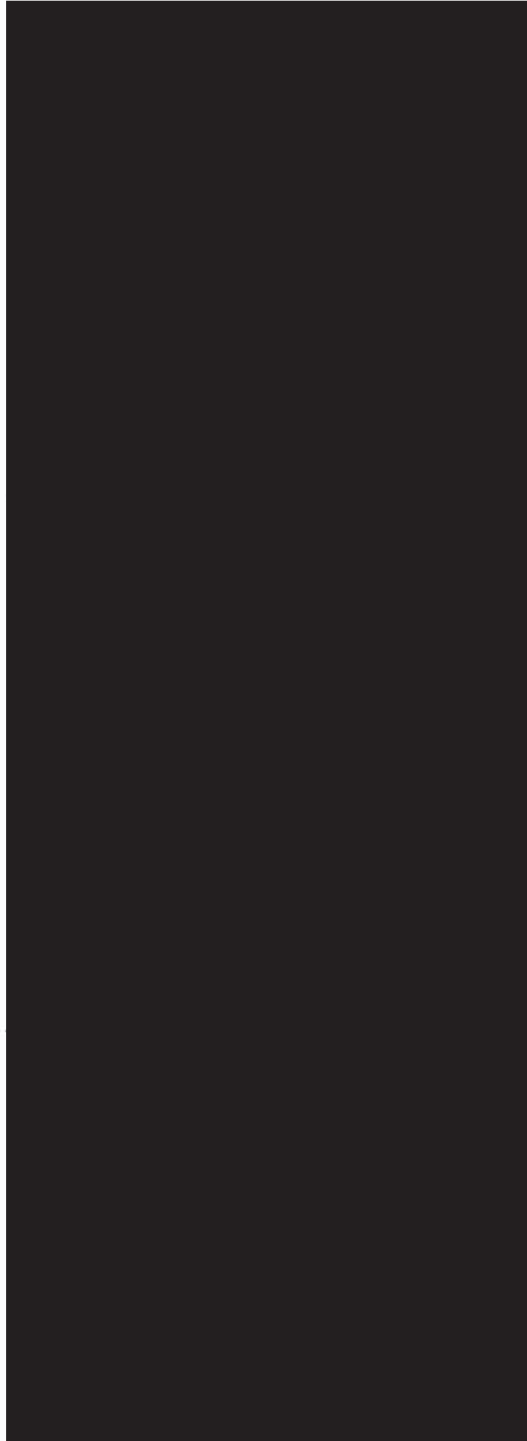

A native of the Philippines and Harvard Law grad, "Mat" is no stranger to the peninsula where one of his three grown children, a daughter is a resident of Sunnyvale.

Menlo Club's Pres. Irv Ericson presided over this fine joint meeting held in the Menlo Presbyterian Church's fellowship hall.

A trustee of the Rotary Foundation, Pres.-Elect Caparas gave an interesting and inspiring disclosure of the operations and accomplishments of the Foundation. With assets in excess of 80 million, the Foundation received contributions of over 24 mill. last year alone and by its rules must spend what it receives within 3 yrs. And in managing these funds the Foundation achieved a net return last year in excess of 29%.

Little wonder the number of scholarships granted this year total 883. Next year it will be 945 and the year after 1315. Who in the world does so much for world peace and understanding!

And helping those funds to swell were the addition of two new P.H. fellows from our own club presented with their exciting awards on the 29th: Deanna Dooley and Ina Chaffey - from Bob and George, of course.

COMING UP Bill Conklin has the word on special events: the dinner & show in S.F. on the 21st - motor coach included and tailgating and the Big Game down on the Farm on the 23rd.

Next week - the 19th - Prog.Chm. Bob Stiff says you'll be entertained by the "Goldenaires" a senior citizens choir well known throughout the Bay Area.

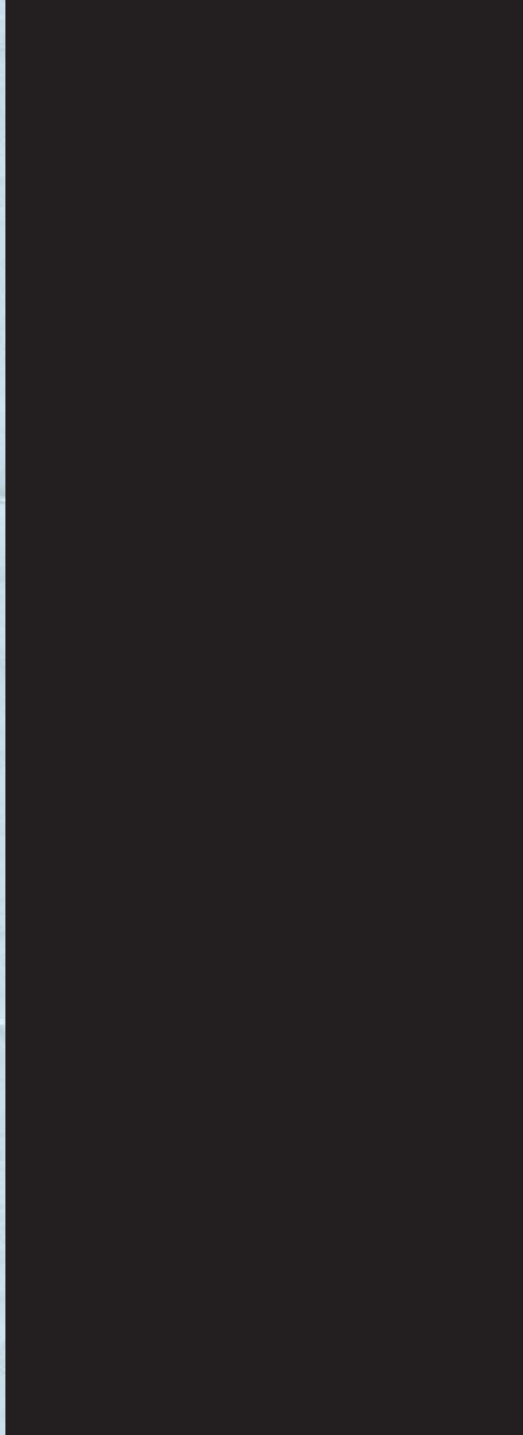

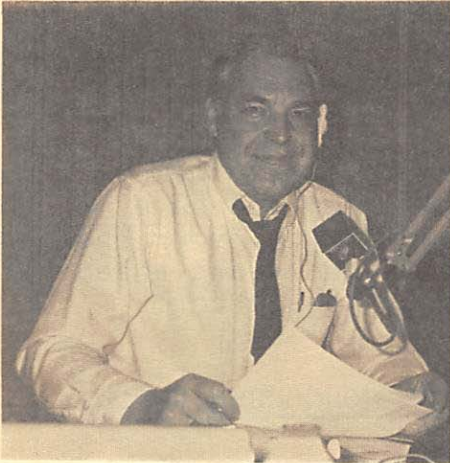

Take a fresh look at interstate banking... banks and S&Ls are advertising in out-of-state papers, using 800 numbers to attract your savings.

Chase Manhattan Bank (based in Wilmington, DE) last month offered a 10% FDIC-insured money-market account (until Nov 22) with a \$2,500 minimum deposit, and a supply of free personalized checks. (The national average on insured money-market accounts has been about 6.5%.) Another "plus" Chase says is their ATM card, good at more than 4,000 locations nationwide.

After the first month, you earn "high money-market rates that have consistently outperformed the average of all leading money-market accounts nationwide." Chase sweetened the deal with an immediate \$25 cash bonus. Information on the money-market account: 1-800-441-8167. On the ATM card: 1-800-THE-PLUS.

We've learned that some banks and S&Ls are paying higher interest rates on CDs to out-of-staters than to residents of their own state. Coast Savings of Los Angeles recently offered residents of Indiana, Hawaii, Oregon and Washington 8.1% on a six-month CD, while offering only 7.7% to California depositors.

Turn to our back page for a moment... we list the highest rates for insured CDs each month, but a word of caution: rates can change frequently. With high rates, S&Ls can attract deposits in a hurry. To stem the flow of money, they can cut the rate as much as 1 or 2% overnight. The rates are supplied only as a guideline, something for you to compare with rates offered in your area.

More on banks offering mutual funds. Last month's Special Report on Security Pacific National Bank's Pacific Horizon mutual fund was only the beginning. Chase Manhattan Bank offers Park Avenue New York Tax Exempt Money-Market Fund and Park Avenue Tax Exempt Intermediate Bond Fund. Both funds are triple tax-free (Federal, State and City income tax) and offered without sales charges and redemption fees (1-800-848-4350, New York City 1-718-895-1219).

* * * * *

End of mortgage double whammy... The Federal Home Loan Bank Board has ruled against a common mortgage practice that blocked assumption of an existing mortgage, forcing a seller to pay off the mortgage under a "due-on-sale" clause, then hitting the seller with a prepayment penalty for paying off the loan early.

The no-win situation has cost sellers thousands. The heat applied by real estate agents and sellers resulted in the Board's ruling that lenders must stop demanding a prepayment penalty when they enforce a due-on-sale clause.

* * * * *

On cash value, or permanent life insurance... President Reagan's tax reform package wanted to tax the "cash value build-up" of whole life insurance.

Howls galore from life insurance companies and special interests have all but killed the idea. To soften the opposition, the House Ways & Means Committee wants to tax policy loan interest as current income. On policies issued after Sept 25, the deductibility of interest paid on policy loans would end.

This will affect only those who borrow, making it harder for insurance companies to mobilize grass-roots opposition, make universal life--with its adjustable premiums--more attractive. Policyowners would pay income taxes on

loans after the first \$50,000, which wouldn't be taxed as long as it had to be repaid within five years. But the \$50,000 would be a lifetime exclusion.

* * * * *

Lump-sum pension rollovers can't be reversed. In a new ruling, the IRS now says that you no longer have the choice of rolling over your lump-sum pension distribution into an IRA and then making up your mind on what you want to do.

Many people rolled over the money into an IRA (within 60 days of receipt of funds) so they could change their minds before they filed their tax returns and elect the 10-year tax averaging.

Now, the IRS says, if the lump sum is withdrawn from an IRA, it is subject to ordinary tax and ineligible for 10-year tax averaging.

* * * * *

On banking...Jan 1 marks the end of most interest rate regulations. Banks will be free to pay any interest rate on deposits, including (starting March 31) passbook savings accounts and interest-bearing checking accounts. And the minimum amount to open an account, once \$2,500, now \$1,000, will next year be zero.

Banks are reshaping their check-cashing fees. Most banks, S&Ls won't cash checks other than their own. Now they will charge for cashing their own checks.

We've learned that many banks will charge a fee if their check is cashed at any branch other than the branch that has the account. The fee, ranging from \$3 to \$5, will be levied on "non-branch" accounts. The idea, banks say, is to shoo people who aren't branch customers out of the crowded branches.

Some S&Ls have low-cost "Supersaving" checking accounts that allow three free checks each month. These are not checking accounts. Each additional check can cost as much as \$10.

Banks and S&Ls are under pressure to cut the 20% interest rate on credit cards. Variable interest rates may spread, although banks don't like them.

The big money-maker for banks is the bounced-check fee. Ranging from \$10 to \$20, they cost banks only 37¢ to \$1 to process. An estimated 1% of all checks bounce, generating huge fee income. Several class action lawsuits over NSF checks will come to trial in the next few months.

On interstate banking, look for it to gain momentum next year. Supreme Court said it's OK to expand regionally and more and more states will allow it. Northeast will be followed by Midwest and Mid-Atlantic. Some states, like Arizona, will let in all comers.

You can expect wholesale turf battles next year in banking. Many small and medium-sized regional banks and S&Ls will be gobbled up by invading big banks. And many of the buyers will be from outside the banking business... firms like General Electric, Ford Motor, and Weyerhaeuser Timber Company.

* * * * *

Look for more smaller firms to "lease" employees. An outside firm hires the employees, provides benefits, pays them. Employees like the benefits and job security they often did not have.

Small business owners like leasing employees because they can put in fancy pensions, retirement plans for themselves...as the only employees in the firm.

Tax reform is getting muddled... more and more likely that a bill won't get through the House this year. If it does, it will be so watered down that much of the tax reform idea will be lost. Keep in mind that nothing is dead and buried this year. Proposals go over to the second session of this Congress, but most bills carried over are controversial, especially in an election year.

The big hangups:

Eliminating federal deductions for state and local taxes.

The public's support to rewrite the tax code is fizzling.

We continue to see new tax revenue next year. One idea that keeps surfacing: Value Added Tax or VAT. Its passage would avoid tinkering with the tax code and raise billions of dollars in instant revenue.

* * * * *

Social Security benefits will rise 3.1% on Jan 1, the smallest increase in a decade. Average benefit rise: \$14 a month for individuals, \$24 for couples.

The new year will trigger an increase in both the maximum earnings subject to tax and the tax rate. The earnings ceiling will climb from \$39,600 to \$42,000. That's a tax bite of \$211.20 in new taxes.

That means the maximum tax for employee and employer will top \$6,000 for the first time. The payroll tax will jump from 7.05% to 7.15% for both workers and their employers.

* * * * *

On phone service... federal regulators approved business-telephone services that would cut cost, and in some cases, bypass local telephone networks. Businesses could use private systems as well as local telephone companies to connect to AT&T long lines, build or contract for their own telephone networks.

Expect stock prices of regional telephone holding companies to continue to fall as more phone business bypasses the local phone company. Expect higher phone bills at home. Most likely: increased subscriber line charges that all residential and business customers now pay to local phone concerns.

* * * * *

Live from Wall Street... like being there, right on the Exchange floor. FM radio-linked computer networks allow your home personal computer, without phone lines, to give you non-stop market information.

Signal, from Lotus Software, uses FM broadcasts for this one-way service. All the stock, commodity and option exchanges are available. Basic monthly fee is \$80, each individual exchange is \$20. Call 1-800-762-7538.

Wireless systems, using unused FM radio spectrum space, are moving into business use. Typed messages are sent over the air, cutting out telephones and mail.

* * * * *

Veterans will face a means test for health care if treatment is not connected with service. We told you about this, believe it's the start of wide-spread use of means tests for federal benefits... including Social Security benefits.

Vets with incomes of \$19,000 for singles, \$25,000 with one dependent, will pay fees for VA treatment on space-available basis. And the VA will bill the Vet's insurance company, if there is one.

* * * * *

Year-End Forecast

A gradual decline in interest rates during the first half of '86, maybe 1% or so, then probably increasing some in the second half to a slight rise over present levels. Prime rate will slide 1/2% by spring, then inch back up to close '86 at 10%. CDs will slide about 1% by mid-year, then settle up slightly over present levels by year end. Fixed rates for home mortgages will stay about where they are, around 11 1/2%, later moving up again.

The reason: The Federal Reserve will continue to ease monetary policy... trying to keep the economy growing toward an election year and soften the dollar a bit more. The Feds now believe they can prime the pump without overheating inflation. And if push comes to shove, expect fears of rising inflation to

give way to loosening of credit reins, priming the pump.

My own guess, based on economic cycles over the past several decades, is that in the second half of the year inflation will rise, putting the values back in real estate again. Give the overbuilt real estate industry a chance to catch its breath as new construction slides.

Also consumers are on a buying binge, fueled by credit, as the savings rates fall to a new low. Customers are deeply in hock, the biggest increase in installment debt in three decades. During the first quarter, I expect to see some slowdown in the economy with the Feds easing the money supply.

On the stock market...Its recent runup to new records and improved corporate profits. Interest rates may slide a bit, but I don't see improved earnings, and expectations could be dashed by early spring. Then I'd expect the market to fall to the 1200 range on the Dow.

I don't see strong fundamentals under the recent market rise. Most market experts I've talked with see the bull market ending. There is mounting evidence of speculative excesses in the stock market, fueled by lower interest rates, which may have hit bottom or will move only slightly lower.

By mid-year it may move up again, but first it will have to recover from its earlier losses, and it may stall in the 1300 to 1400 range.

On gold and silver...still don't see any major moves up or down. Inflation, the driving force behind any rise, won't be a major factor for most of the next year. With high interest rates--as much as 14%--on investments of the same risk level as precious metals, gold and silver are very costly to hold if you're waiting for a rise in price.

A U.S. gold coin will pass Congress next year, fight for market share with the Canadian Maple Leaf. But the gold will have to come from U.S. mines.

Rare coins, artwork, collectibles, like gold, wait for rising inflation, good times. Most are a crapshoot anyway, and when you buy at retail and later sell at wholesale, you've locked yourself out of any profits for at least two years. Buy these items for the pleasure of owning them, wearing them, not with the idea of making a hefty profit in '86.

Fit this into your own planning...

On savings, you might lock up some high rates on insured CDs.

Home mortgage rates will stay low for a time, with a pickup in single-family homes. Condominiums and apartments will face overbuilding, tax problems.

On borrowing, you might wait until spring. Competition will cut points, other costs.

Try to pay off credit card and installment debt, much of which will remain in the 18 to 20% range no matter where interest rates go.

All in all, 1986 looks like another year of slow growth, increasing federal deficits, with incomes expected to grow only modestly. Not a good year, but on balance, not bad.

From all of us, the best of the holiday season. May 1986 be a year of health and happiness for you.

How to get more out of your IRA

For most people, IRAs are still the best way to save for retirement. Yet two-thirds of the Americans eligible to open an IRA, or about 75 million people, have not done so. Most are younger people in their 30s and 40s, more concerned with cash flow than with retirement, and those of all ages who fail to understand the long-range tax savings built into the IRA program.

The figures on where IRAs are deposited, through 1984, are:

Banks and S&Ls: 59%; credit unions: 6%; mutual funds, insurance companies, brokers: 35%.

Here's a quick review of why you need an IRA:

Anyone who works is eligible. Even if you have a Keogh plan, a Tax Sheltered Annuity, or are covered under your employer's retirement plan, you are still eligible to open an IRA.

Any income will qualify. You can contribute 100% of your income, up to \$2,000 each year. If one spouse is not employed outside the home, you can boost your contributions to \$2,250.

Tax savings come off the top of your income. When you make an IRA contribution, your taxable income is automatically reduced by the amount of the contribution. You may not only reduce your tax base, but you may fall into a lower tax bracket as well. For example:

Suppose you're in a 35% tax bracket. Your \$2,000 IRA contribution is then equivalent to around \$3,000 of taxable income. In other words, if you want to invest \$2,000 in a savings plan and pay your taxes first, you'll need \$3,000 of income; in an IRA, only \$2,000. In a 50% tax bracket, you'll need \$4,000 of income; in an IRA, only \$2,000.

But what's most often misunderstood is that the money you pay in taxes without an IRA is money you'll never earn income on as you build your long-range savings. For example, again in the 35% tax bracket:

If you pay \$700 to Uncle Sam and invest \$1,300, the \$700 is lost forever. If you put the entire \$2,000 into an IRA, all the money goes to work for you! In just ten years, at 11% interest, that \$700 lost to taxes will amount to around \$2,000. In twenty years, about \$5,700.

Over just the next ten years, assuming you stay in the same tax bracket and earn 11% interest on your long-term investments, that \$700 you gave to the government each year by investing outside an IRA could be worth about \$13,000. In twenty years, about \$50,000!

Smart tax planning. You have until April 15, 1986, or until you file your tax return, to open or make a contribution to this year's IRA. The sooner you make a contribution, the more tax-deferred income you can earn each year. But let's say you're short of cash and tax filing is fast approaching. What do you do?

Given the tax advantages, borrowing for an IRA may be a smart way out. For example: If you're in the 35% tax bracket and borrow \$2,000 at 14%, the \$280 in interest charges in a year (lower interest charges if you pay off the loan during the year) will produce a \$98 tax write-off AND the IRA will save you about \$700 in taxes.

That's a net gain of \$518 by borrowing money to take the IRA deduction before you file your tax return. (\$700 tax savings, plus \$98 interest deduction, minus \$280 interest expense.)

Self-directed or regular IRA? Self-directed IRAs are gaining in popularity as investors seek a wider array of options. With so many new investment and savings plans on the market, many people like the options of putting part of their IRA money into high-growth stock funds, real estate partnerships, even speculative stocks. There are basically four kinds of IRAs:

Regular IRAs. The kind you'd open at a bank or savings and loan. Regular IRAs usually allow only investments and savings plans from the sponsoring financial institution, and for this limitation, are available without cost.

Self-directed IRAs. These IRAs are available from brokers, insurance companies, mutual funds, financial planners. Since they allow you to make investments in almost any saving or investment product, they carry a fee to open the account and a yearly management fee. You should expect to pay about \$35 to \$50 to open the account and about \$35 to \$50 a year for management fees.

Rollover IRAs. These IRAs are for lump-sum distributions you receive from an employer-sponsored pension or retirement plan. You have 60 days from receipt of the money to roll over the cash or securities into an IRA. Because you may want to return this money to another employer-sponsored retirement plan some day, it's a good idea to open a separate IRA for this purpose.

SEP-IRAs. These IRAs are part of an employer-sponsored retirement plan, called a Simplified Employee Pension. Under a SEP-IRA, the employer opens your IRA and makes contributions on your behalf. Once the contributions are made, you have full control over a SEP-IRA, just as you would over a regular IRA. Current law allows contributions up to \$30,000 each year into a SEP-IRA, but most contributions range from \$3,000 to \$8,000.

What's ahead for IRAs?

In the tax reform bill now in Congress, we believe that changes are unlikely in the IRA program.

President Reagan's idea to give non-working spouses the same \$2,000 contribution limit as working spouses will not pass. Non-working spouses will be left with an additional \$250 a year in contributions.

401(k) salary reduction plans, which are much better than IRAs (see January 1985 Special Report) may be cut back from their current maximum contribution level of \$30,000 to around \$8,000. The other change Congress is talking about is that if you take part in a 401(k) plan, you won't be able also to make contributions to an IRA.

The good news is that the Securities Exchange Commission and the National Association of Securities Dealers (for OTC stock) are considering new IRA rules to deal with one of the biggest complaints registered by consumers: the difficulty of transferring stock from one IRA to another. Brokers will suffer penalties if the investments aren't promptly made.

The Big Promises of Some Air Fares Get Lost in a Tangle of Restrictions

Welcome to the wild and wacky world of airline deregulation, 1985 style. Like financial deregulation, with savings rates and bank fees a jungle of confusion, many air fares get lost in a tangle of restrictions.

The advertisements proclaim low fares in six-inch tall letters while the restrictions are buried in the fine print. That's because deep discounting by the major airlines is providing travelers with unprecedented bargains -- and risks. Here are some tips to keep in mind when you search for low-cost airline tickets.

Booking your ticket: The catch here is that if you wait until thirty days before the flight to book your reservations (the minimum time for most "Super Saver" tickets), the discount seats may be gone, but if you call earlier, your chances of having to cancel increase. The "unbelievably low fares" that get the six-inch tall headlines usually apply to just a few seats per plane.

Changing flight plans after booking often brings not only a stiff penalty for canceling, but the payment of "regular" fare for your next ticket. On a round-trip "Plan Ahead Discount Fare" ticket between Phoenix and Baltimore on Delta Air Lines, the price was \$276. A terrific deal, if all goes well. But if the trip is pushed back or forward to another day, the discount fare reverts to the standard coach fare of \$389. On top of that, the \$276 you've paid for the discount fare is subject to a 25% penalty for cancellation or a \$207 refund.

The bottom line: A round-trip discount fare of \$276 can soar to a total cost of \$458 if you change the time or date of this discount ticket. If you must change your travel plans, see if your travel agent can sell your ticket to someone else, or if possible, use the discount ticket and take a hotel room for a day or two at your destination.

Hidden City Ticket: Getting off half way makes a lot of sense in today's crazy air fare war. In making frequent trips to Dallas and Houston from Kansas City, for instance, a Kansas City traveler will find that he is paying \$100 more for his Dallas trips than his Houston trips, even though his Houston flights stop first in Dallas. So if you need to go from Kansas City to Dallas, book a flight to Houston, carry your luggage, save the \$100, and get off in Dallas.

Other examples: Houston to Chicago on United Airlines is \$279, Houston by way of Atlanta to Chicago, only \$115. Detroit to Dallas on American or Delta is \$296, Detroit by way of Denver to Dallas, only \$150. A flight from San Francisco to Boston is usually much less expensive if you (a) fly via New York, or (b) fly a discount carrier from San Francisco to New York and then pay the regular fare from New York to Boston.

Split Fares: Another tactic smart travelers use to cut their air fare costs is to use two cheap connecting flights rather than one direct flight (which often is a one- or two-stop flight anyway). If you make frequent trips (within 30 days of each other) for the first trip, use the first leg of each ticket; on the second visit, use both return portions.

Turning the 'MIKE' on KGO's Chris Bjorklund

Ever feel "ripped off"? - You're not alone! Since 1981, KGO's Consumer Reporter, Chris Bjorklund, has resolved thousands of consumer complaints for KGO listeners. You can hear Chris' consumer reports each weekday during the KGO Morning and Afternoon News.

Q How long have you been fighting consumer battles?

A I started back in 1973 with the Better Business Bureau in Denver. From then on the bug sort of bit me. I went to graduate school and got a masters degree in consumer economics. From there I went to work for the District Attorney's Office in San Francisco for three years. Through that job I met all the radio and TV consumer reporters and I began to think maybe that's what I wanted to do next.

Q How many consumer complaints does your KGO Radio Action staff handle each month?

A We receive between 200 and 300 written complaints each month. Overall, we have an 80-85% success rate...meaning that both the business and the customer come away with some kind of solution they can live with...both parties are satisfied.

Q Do you consider yourself to be a good shopper?

A For some things. I'll do my best to save a few cents on my groceries, but I must admit that I'm an impulse buyer on occasion. For example, a couple years ago I was looking for a VCR to rent on New Year's Eve, couldn't find one to rent...so I said...let's buy one. So I bought the first one I saw. I think you'd go nuts if you tried to do too much comparison shopping. But I am a fanatic on labels...I always read them!

Q What are your favorite consumer types of cases to handle?

A I've developed a special interest in financial services...ie, banks, savings and loans, mortgage companies, etc. I seem to be getting more and more questions on bank policies and consumer rights in those situations.

Q What was the most noteworthy case you ever worked on?

A Since I've been at KGO, one of my pet projects involved a job listing agency. They were charging people \$25-\$35 for a computer printout of job listings. It turned out that these printouts were just job leads taken out of the newspaper. I jumped on this one before the DA. We went undercover...reported the findings on-air, then we assisted the District Attorney's office in shutting down this job listing service.

Q How do you relax off the air?

A It's very difficult to relax when I'm not at work because I have two young children. But...I try to jog a couple times a week, I play on a co-ed soccer team...and I try to go out with my husband as often as possible!

Kidney Stones and Water

Kidney stone patients are often told to drink lots of water because it dilutes their urine. Israel happens to have one of the highest rates of kidney stones in the world, and patients there have always been told to drink lots of water. Well, it turns out this may be bad advice, as doctors found that the water in Israel is unusually hard and had lots of calcium and that when patients were drinking lots of water, they were taking in more calcium and then having more problems. When they took a group of patients and asked them to boil the water first, which effectively lowers the calcium level in the water, they found many of their symptoms were disappearing. Hard water is a common occurrence in the United States, so if you live in a hard water area and you're drinking lots of it and have kidney stones, you might make yourself aware of this.

Too often, they say, the advertised 60-percent discounts are for charter flights. Anyone can get in on those lower prices without joining a club. Also many of the hotel discounts are rate reductions on high-priced hotel rooms . . . no bargain for cost-conscious travellers.

Owen Spann Talks with John Naisbitt, author of *The Year Ahead*, about 1986

Spann: I'm going to start by putting you on the spot. We've seen a shake out in high-tech . . . has Silicon Valley peaked out?

Naisbitt: I don't think it's peaked out. It's part of a process that will go on for a long time. We're going to see thousands and thousands of computer and software companies go under. It's a measure of the vitality of this new economy.

Spann: What's going to happen with retailing in the future?

Naisbitt: Competition is just ferocious. On the one hand we're having a lot of off-price stores, like Mervyns. On the other hand, there's an incredible increase in the number of boutiques . . . and what's dropping through the cracks is department stores.

Spann: What's the future hold for lawyers and doctors?

Naisbitt: Well there's such an oversupply of lawyers and doctors. In the years ahead, we're going to see in incredible amount of marketing and advertising from doctors and lawyers.

Spann: If you were entering college now, what fields would you be looking at?

Naisbitt: I would spend my four years learning how to learn! I think Liberal Arts is a great direction to prepare people for the information society . . . because they have got to learn the process of learning.

Spann: What about the home of the future?

Naisbitt: Our homes are smaller but smarter. The smarter side of it is the application of microprocessors. The first application of microprocessors was in toys . . . now they're all over our homes in connection with our kitchens, entertainment centers, security systems . . . everywhere.

Caller: My son is majoring in sports medicine and physical therapy and I was wondering what the future holds for that as a service and product to sell?

Naisbitt: That's certainly a growth area. We're a nation of clerks . . . and as a nation of clerks we're very involved in our physical well-being . . . so there's a great future for sports medicine.

Spann: Isn't Boston one of the great turn-a-round cities in the country?

Naisbitt: It's the biggest city by far that's gone from the old economy to the new. Boston has full employment now. They're busing people down from New Hampshire, Maine and Vermont because they don't have enough people for the jobs in Boston. It's got the kind of full employment that other parts of the country are moving to at a great rate.
