The 77th Annual Convention of Rotary International officially opened on Saturday June 1, 1986, in Las Vegas, Nevada. The business of the convention is conducted in Plenary session the first of which was held Sunday at 4:00 P.M.

The inevitable reports of the operations of RI were interspersed with examples of the dynamism of the good done by Rotarians throughout the world. More than once handkerchiefs were dabbed on wet cheeks watching Dr. Joe Serra's report on the Malawi Rotary Polio rehabilitation project.

The Presidential citation award was bestowed on "Mother" Clara Hale for her work in Harlem with children born with congenital drug addiction.

The 1986 Rotary Award for World Understanding was given to the International Committee of the Red Cross and was accepted by Harold Schmidt de Grunck on behalf of that organization.

CHARLES C. KELLER of California, Pennsylvania was elected RI President for 1987-88 and PHILIP H. LINDSEY was introduced as the new General Secretary of Rotary.

TONY BENNETT closed the convention with an hour long performance, the capstone and finale of which was "I left my heart in San Francisco".

#### COMMITTEES

Our Rotary Club operates through committees which have the task of devising and putting into effect plans that guide and assist the members of the club in discharging their responsibilities in the following areas of service: Community Service, International Service, Vocational Service and club service.

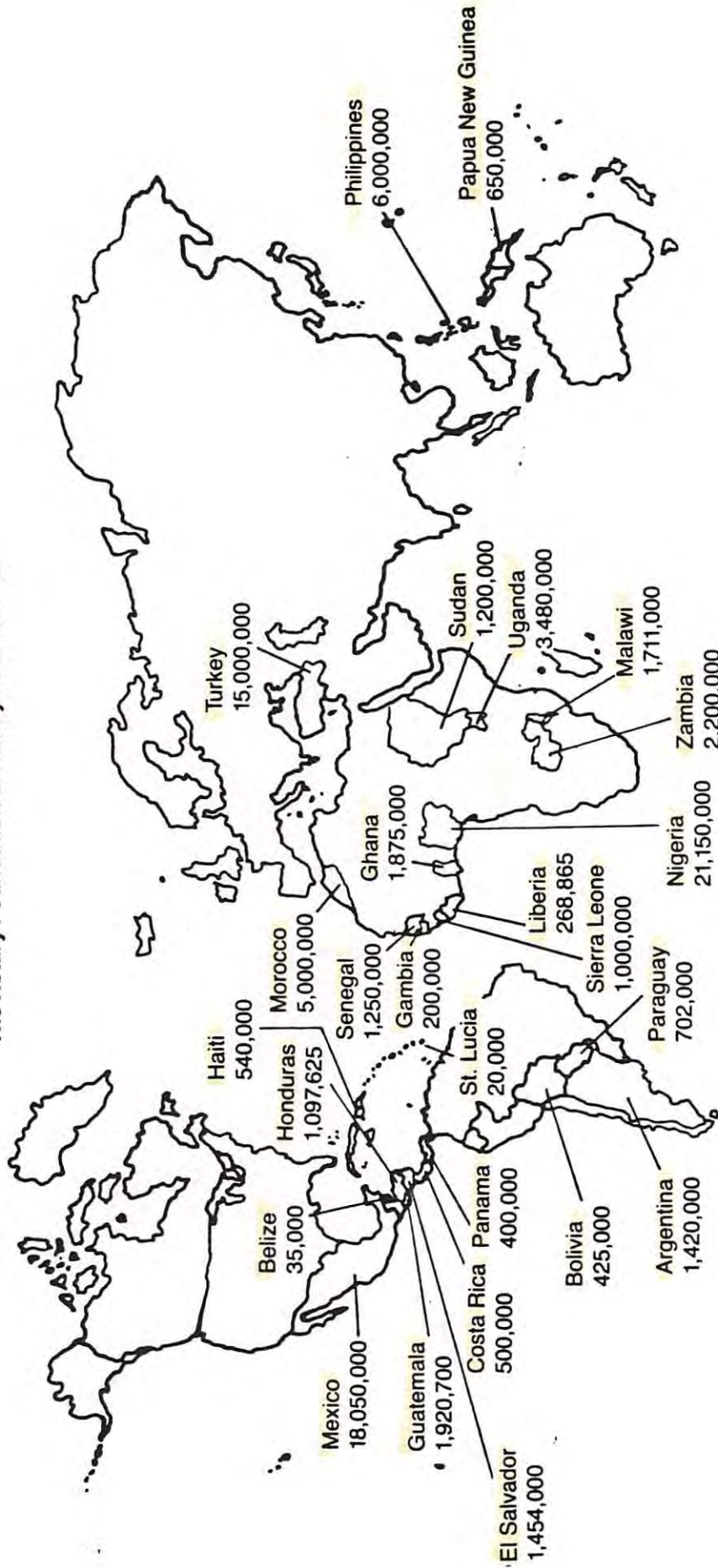

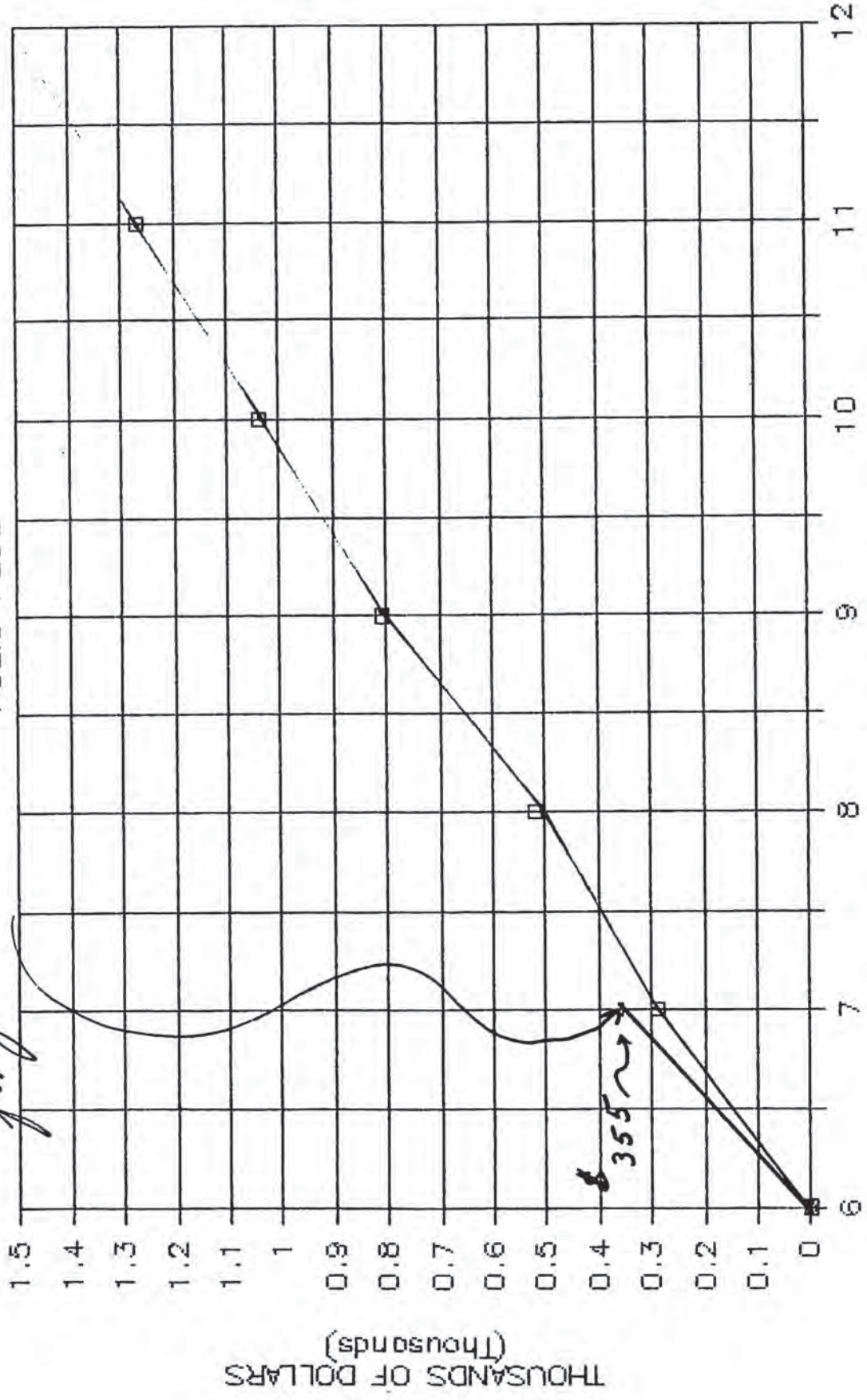

## ANSWERS TO SOME BASIC QUESTIONS ABOUT POLIOPLUS

Q. Why has Rotary established the PolioPlus program?

A. The 1917 Convention of Rotary International established a Foundation "for the (purposed) of doing good in the world." The Rotary's Foundation retains the goal of "doing good" through educational, charitable and other avenues of service. The Health, Hunger and Humanity (3-H) program, established during Rotary's 75th anniversary year (1978), is one such avenue. From it has come another, PolioPlus, built on the fact that 75 million children go without polio protection each year. The disease kills many and cripples one out of 200.

Q. Can Rotary expect help from other organizations in the polio fight?

A. All of Rotary's PolioPlus efforts are carried out in partnership with and in support of the World Health Organization, the Pan American Health Organization, the United Nations Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), and the national ministries of health in the polio-endemic countries. In some instances we also work with other non-governmental organizations like our own. No other volunteer organization is so uniquely qualified -- by its spirit of "service above self," its ideals of world understanding, and its world-wide membership -- as is Rotary.

Q. Why US \$120 million?

A. It is estimated that 100 million babies are born each year in countries where polio is not yet controlled. To assure polio immunity, Rotary consultant Dr. Albert Sabin recommends two doses of oral polio vaccine each year for three years -- six doses total. Vaccine used in PolioPlus immunization campaigns generally is purchased at a cost of 4 cents per dose. Rotary has pledged to support any national immunization program for up to five years. Those facts are the source for this equation:

$$100,000,000 \text{ (newborns a year)} \times 6 \text{ (doses)} \times .04 \text{ (cents)} \times 5 \text{ (years)} = \$120 \text{ million}$$

Q. What will PolioPlus funds be spent on?

A. Rotary's pledge is to provide all the polio vaccines needed for up to five consecutive years in any approved immunization program of a national or regional health agency. When invited by the national or a state minister of health in a developing country, Rotary also will make available an International Immunization Task Force to help assess, plan and implement immunization activities that promise lasting results. Occasionally, PolioPlus funds may purchase vaccines besides polio to supplement those from other sources. But the non-polio vaccines will be primarily purchased by host governments or provided by other donors.

Q. Why the "plus" in PolioPlus?

A. Rotary's emphasis is on polio, but it also recognizes that each year five million children die from six diseases that could be prevented by immunization: polio, measles, diphtheria, tuberculosis, tetanus, and pertussis. The World Health Organization's Expanded Program of Immunization seeks to immunize all the world's children against these diseases by 1990. PolioPlus has revived hope for achieving that goal. To deliver several vaccines is not much more difficult than delivering one. By accelerating vaccination delivery, PolioPlus also helps to increase world attention to all aspects of improving child and maternal health.

Q. How is the immunization done?



- A. Rotary will participate in any nation's immunization program at the invitation of the appropriate government health authority. Rotary insists, however, that the proposed program meet certain conditions. One is that it supports the objectives of the Expanded Program of Immunization of the World Health Organization. Therefore, Rotary favors projects combining polio immunization with inoculation against other diseases. It is also expected that any immunization project will be endorsed and supported by Rotarians of the targeted country and that they will help in carrying it out. (Projects in non-Rotary countries are not ruled out, however.) Through its organizational structure and the expected participation of professional and volunteer workers, each project must show probability of reaching at least 80 percent of the children in the targeted age range and the targeted geographical area.
- Q. How do PolioPlus and the 3-H Program interrelate?
- A. The 3-H Program has supported a number of immunization projects. With the commitment to attack polio worldwide, it was felt a separate program was warranted. While PolioPlus will absorb ongoing and future polio immunization projects, 3-H will continue to support other health-related areas, including some non-polio immunization projects.
- Q. Will the "public" phase of PolioPlus fund-raising include use of professional fund-raisers?
- A. No. Professional counsel will advise the international PolioPlus Campaign Committee, but they will not carry out direct fund-raising activities. Rather, individual Rotary Clubs and groups of clubs are expected to devise imaginative and effective profit-making schemes. Many already have done so.
- Q. Can a Rotary Club or District in one part of the world restrict its contribution for use in another part of the world?
- A. No. PolioPlus projects generally will be nationwide in scope. Even in relatively small countries, the cost of a nationwide immunization campaign will be beyond the fund-raising capabilities of most clubs and districts. Also, such restriction would create complex administrative problems.
- Q. Are PolioPlus contributions eligible for Rotary Foundation recognition?
- A. PolioPlus contributions are eligible for Paul Harris Fellow and Paul Harris Sustaining Member recognition, for Memorials and Plateau Credit but not for Reward Units. In addition, national PolioPlus Campaign committees will offer other recognition.
- Q. How much of the money contributed to PolioPlus will actually go for immunization projects?
- A. Administration and fund-raising costs must be supported by the fund itself, not by other Rotary Foundation resources, but these costs may not exceed 10 percent of the total amount raised.
- Q. Are Rotarians firmly behind the PolioPlus Campaign?
- A. Ninety-eight percent of District Governor-Nominees say they are enthusiastic, and 92 percent say they believe their districts support it. A Rotary Council on Legislation resolution endorsed the commitment to immunize the world's children against polio as soon as possible, no later than 2005.



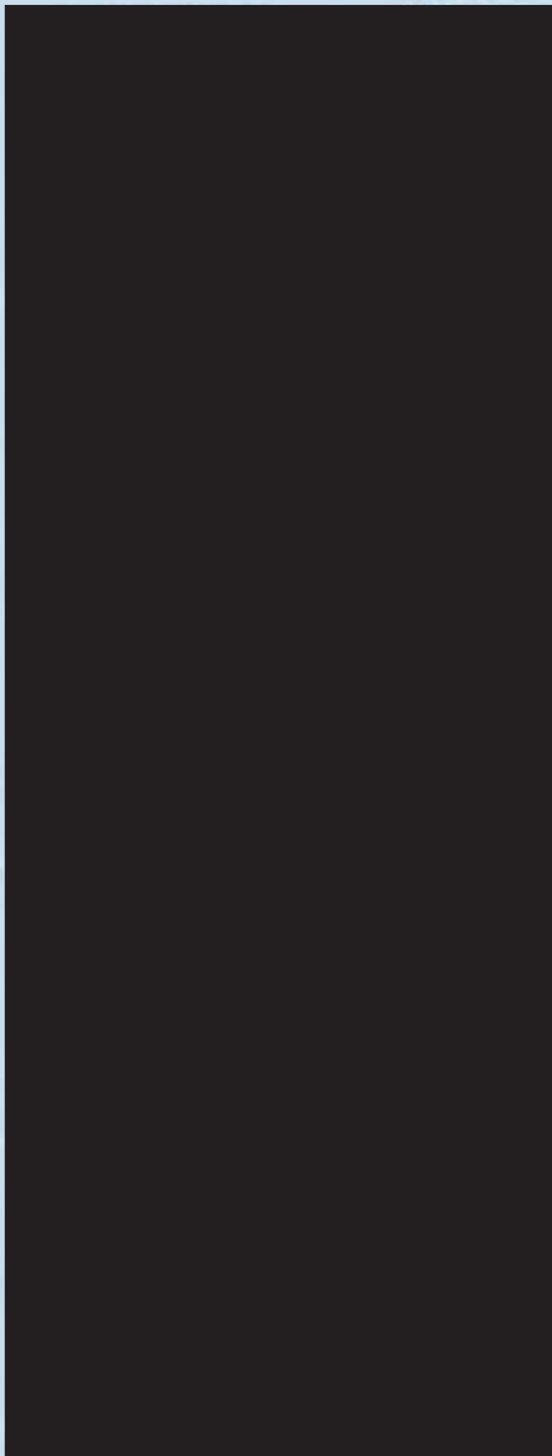

**AVENUES OF SERVICE:** In 1922 the RI convention refined the "objects" of Rotary. The early versions had emphasized the "business motives" but the gradual evolvement of goals reflected concerns common to a new organization; e.g., in 1910 the first object was "to extend and develop Rotary principles by the organization of affiliating Rotary clubs throughout America." The 1912 convention talked about "standardizing" Rotary principles, and the first model constitution and by-laws for a Rotary club was approved, with five objects covering such things as promoting the worthiness of all legitimate occupations, encouragement of high ethical standards, increasing efficiency by exchanging ideas, promoting acquaintance, and quickening the interest of each member in the public welfare and civic development.

In 1915 a sixth object was added to the club objects, "to stimulate the desire of each member to be of service to his fellow men and society in general." There were slight differences between the objects of the international organization and those suggested for the Rotary club until 1922, when the same objects were established. There were six objects until 1935 when the Mexico City Convention adopted four objects. In 1951 the convention agreed that Rotary had only one object with four parts. These parts, then, became the "four avenues of service": club, vocational, community, and international respectively.

**ARE WE READY FOR FOUNDATION MONTH?** November is Rotary Foundation Month and we are asked to voluntarily consider a contribution to the Rotary International Foundation to support Rotary International scholarships and projects. A Rotarian may become a Paul Harris Fellow by making either a one-time \$1,000 contribution or becoming a sustaining member with an annual gift of \$100 until the cumulative amount reaches \$1,000.

The objective of the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International is the achievement of world understanding and peace through international charitable and educational programs. Rotary's Foundation was begun in 1917 by Arch Klumph, 6th International Pres. of Rotary, who convinced a Rotary convention of the need for an endowment for "doing good in the world" in charitable, educational or other avenues of service.

The Rotary Foundation now funds each year: 1) Approximately 1,000 scholarships for graduate, undergraduate, vocational and journalism scholars, and teachers of the handicapped; 2) Some 150 group Study Exchanges; 3) More than 70 international humanitarian projects through Special Grants and Health, Hunger, and Humanity Grants; and 4) Approximately 10 grants for University Teachers, to teach in nations other than their own, especially in developing countries.

This November, let's publicize the work of the foundation in our community. Something as fine as The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International should not be kept a secret.

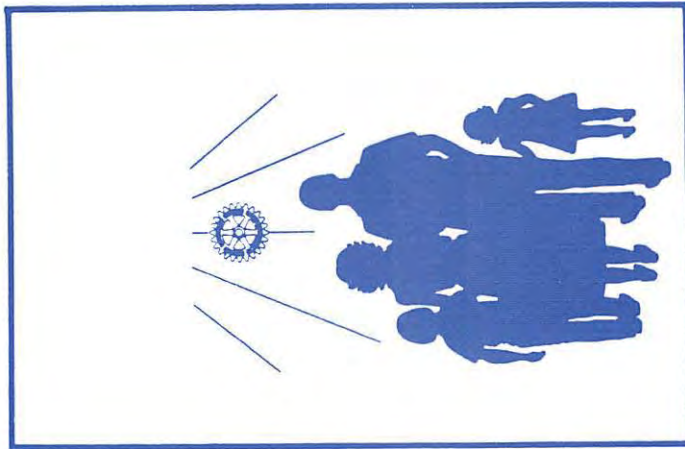

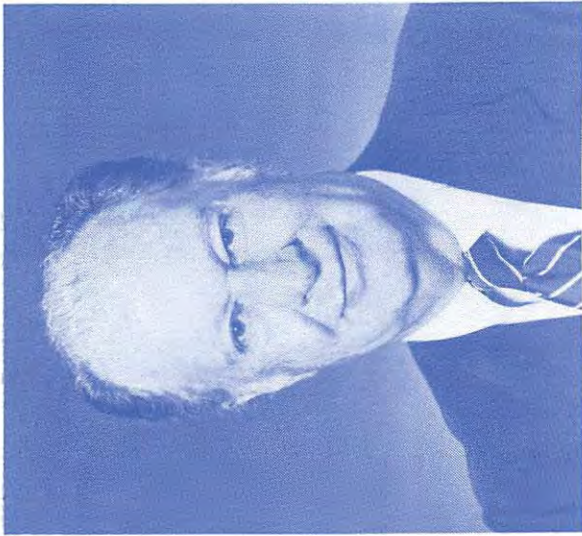

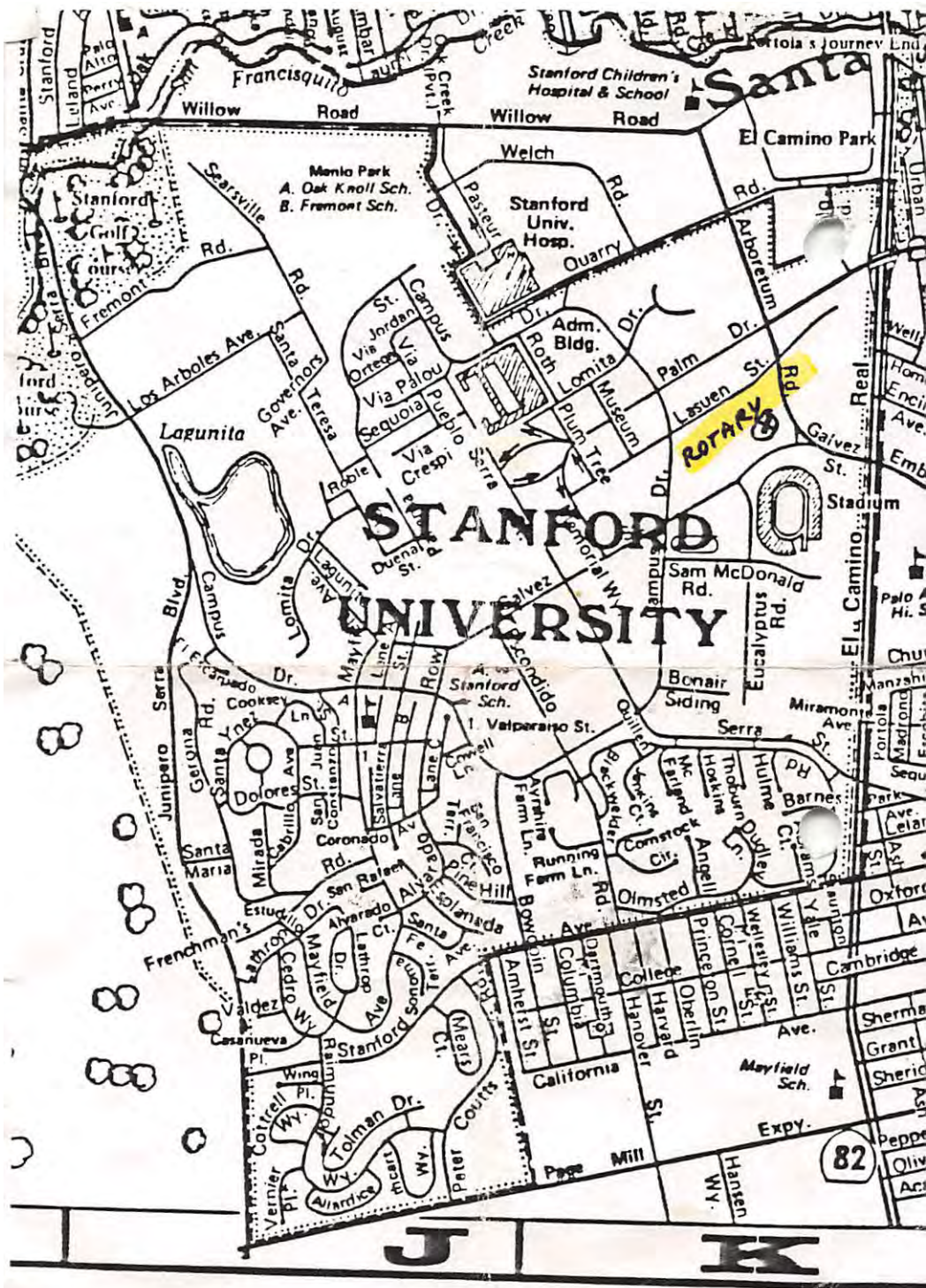

### BEST WISHES FOR THE HOLIDAY SEASON



#### LAFAYETTE GINGERBREAD.

Five eggs.  
Half a pound of brown sugar.  
Half a pound of fresh butter.  
A pint of sugar-house molasses.  
A pound and a half of flour.  
Four table-spoonfuls of ginger.  
Two large sticks of cinnamon,  
Three dozen grains of allspice, } powdered and sifted.  
Three dozen of cloves,  
The juice and grated peel of two large lemons.

Stir the butter and sugar to a cream. Beat the eggs very well. Pour the molasses, at once, into the butter and sugar. Add the ginger and other spice, and stir all well together.

Put in the egg and flour alternately, stirring all the time. Stir the whole very hard, and put in the lemon at the last. When the whole is mixed, stir it till very light.

Butter an earthen pan, or a thick tin or iron one, and put the gingerbread in it. Bake it in a moderate oven, an hour or more, according to its thickness. Take care that it does not burn.

Or you may bake it in small cakes, on little tins.

Its lightness will be much improved by a small tea-spoonful of pearl-ash dissolved in a table-spoonful of milk, and stirred lightly in at the last. Too much pearl-ash will give it an unpleasant taste.

If you use pearl-ash, you must omit the lemon, as its taste will be entirely destroyed by the pearl-ash. You may substitute for the lemon, some raisins and currants, well floured, to prevent their sinking.

This is the finest of all gingerbread, but should not be kept long, as in a few days it becomes very hard and stale.

**R.I. Board of Directors Action:** Two significant decisions were passed by the R.I. Board at its fall meeting:

1) R.I. Cooperation with Other Organizations -The Board rescinded two previous decisions with respect to Rotary International's policy concerning R.I. cooperation with other organizations and authorized the general secretary, district governors and their representatives, and Rotary clubs, to support and cooperate with other organizations and entities in specific projects and activities when such initiatives are consistent with Rotary ideals and purposes.

2) Women in Rotary - Clubs worldwide are requested to recognize women members who have been inducted in California. The appeal of R.I. to the California decision is going forward, however, R.I. is anticipating changes to the constitution to provide for women. They are also initiating an opinion survey is to be conducted worldwide to determine current attitude of Rotarians and clubs regarding the male - only membership provisions.

## Women join Redwood Rotary

Berlin noted that Sandra Day O'Connor, the only woman U.S. Supreme Court justice, had "recused" or disqualified herself from the case because she had just won an award from Soroptimist International, an organization of top women in management. Based upon the questions the Supreme Court Justices asked the attorneys in the case arising out of a Duarte Rotary Club's refusal to admit women, Berlin told Redwood City Rotarians the Court apparently was seeking a limited constitutional basis for any ruling on admission of women rather than any sweeping decision.

Two business managers became the first women to be inducted into the Redwood City Rotary Club Tuesday.

Elizabeth Berlin, manager of Redwood Travel, and Judy Smith, district manager for the Redwood City office of the California State Automobile Association, became part of the Rotary chapter, which joined a handful of other Northern California Rotary clubs to let women into their ranks.

"Any group can benefit from having men's and women's input," said Berlin, whose father is Sidney Berlin, a Redwood City Rotarian and district governor of the Rotary district stretching from Menlo Park to the Oregon border.

"A lot of people say to me, 'Are you sure you want to be in the same group as your dad,'" Berlin said, acknowledging that she did.

The 24-year-old graduate of the University of California, Los Angeles, has been working for her mother's travel agency since she was 12.

Dear Fellow Rotarians:

We live in a special time, an exciting time—for us as Rotarians and as citizens of the world. The whole world is our community, so we have the opportunity to serve all people and to seek peace to extend ourselves in extraordinary efforts and actions that promote the well-being of people of all ages in every region of our home, the planet Earth.

We also live in a time of promise, because we are ROTARIANS—UNITED IN SERVICE—DEDICATED TO PEACE. When you and I became Rotarians, we entered into a contract with our fellowman. Together, we Rotarians have made a promise, a commitment to service and peace, which has its source in a special quality of the heart of the individual, and in a special community of fellowship in the Rotary club.

This Rotary year, 1987-88, is an extraordinary year because of the exceptional challenge of PolioPlus. For all of us, our response will require a strong financial effort. For many, it will also call for personal involvement to free the children of the world from the terrible scourge, poliomyelitis. But this is Rotary at its best—when Rotarians become personally involved.

As we reach out in this year of extraordinary effort, the great imperative of our time is a world at peace. Our special contribution to the search for peace is our people-to-people effort to replace suspicion with friendliness, and to allay suffering with service. We have learned that peace is not simply the absence of war, as love is not merely the absence of hate.

## POLIOPLUS



- POLIOPLUS is Rotary International's program to help immunize the children of the world against polio and other deadly diseases. Rotary International has pledged to promote and assist polio immunization worldwide in partnership with governments and international health agencies.
- Rotary International's emphasis is on polio, but the problem is bigger than polio alone. Each year 4,000,000 children die from six dreaded diseases that could be prevented by immunization: polio, measles, diphtheria, tuberculosis, tetanus and pertussis (whooping cough). The vaccines to prevent these diseases reach fewer than one in five children in many developing nations.
- It is estimated that 100,000,000 babies are born each year in developing countries. To assure polio immunity, up to six doses of the oral polio vaccine (approx. 4¢ per dose) may be required. 100 million (newborns) x 6 (doses) x 4¢ x 5 years = \$120,000,000. This figure is for polio vaccine only; additional funds may also be provided for other vaccines and equipment where needed.
- It is anticipated that the funds will be raised from Rotarians and through Rotarians, with Rotarians themselves contributing the majority of the total.
- The POLIOPLUS CAMPAIGN must be an EXTRAORDINARY effort and considered a priority among all Rotarians. Each Rotary club will be asked to raise a specific goal.
- The POLIOPLUS CAMPAIGN consists of three phases:
  - July 1986-June 1987: Organization, Education, Major Gift Solicitation
  - July 1987-July 1988: Intensive Fund Raising Activities and Special Events
  - July 1988-December 1990 and beyond: Gift Payment Period

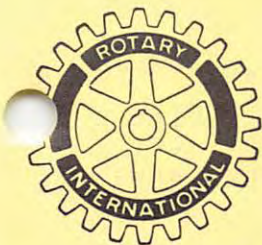

NEXT WEEK: That will be June 2, and with JERRY MERTENS as Program Chairman for the month you can be sure it will be a good program.

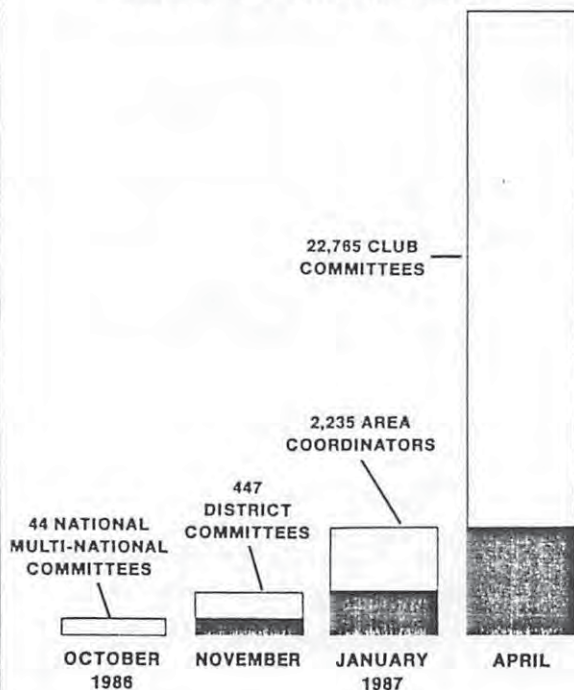
And if the schedule holds, your finemaster will be DR. GREENWELL and that too will be good - though not necessarily for you.

## THOUSANDS VOLUNTEER FOR POLIOPLUS

Nearly a year and one-half ago, the International POLIOPLUS Campaign Committee was formed and, since then, the number of Campaign volunteers has risen steadily. Earlier this year, nearly 2,500 Area Coordinators (Campaign Leaders who will work closely with a handful of clubs in their assigned Area) came on board.

Recently, however, our volunteer base *ballooned* with the addition of thousands of *Club* committee members. Volunteers at this level now comprise about 95 percent of all present Campaign volunteers!

## NOTEWORTHY ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS

To date, a number of Rotary clubs have initiated special activities and projects to benefit POLIOPLUS:

- \* The West Knoxville, Tennessee, U.S.A. Club (District # 678) is planning a US\$125-per-man golf tournament with POLIOPLUS receiving a portion of the proceeds.
- \* The men of the Hilton Head Island, South Carolina, U.S.A. Club (District #777) have elected to build a house on the island each year for the next five years. Bingo cards will then be sold and the holder of the winning card will receive the house. The club hopes to clear US\$200,000 on each of the houses for a total contribution of US\$1,000,000 to POLIOPLUS over five years.
- \* The 13 Rotary Clubs in Santa Barbara County, California, U.S.A. (District #524) are working with the Santa Barbara Open PRO/AM Golf Tournament, with a portion of the proceeds going to POLIOPLUS. This is the first year that the Ladies' Professional Golfers Association (LPGA) will sponsor the tournament.
- \* Woodrow B. (Woody) Sigley of Colorado Springs, Colorado, U.S.A. (District #547) is a Rotarian who is *running* for POLIOPLUS. For more than a year he has challenged other area Rotarians to donate US 2 - 10¢ for each mile he runs. He has raised an average of US\$200 - 400 per month.

Word has it that the R.C. Council has given Pres. PETE a Distinguished Service Award in recognition of all his many community activities. Well done!

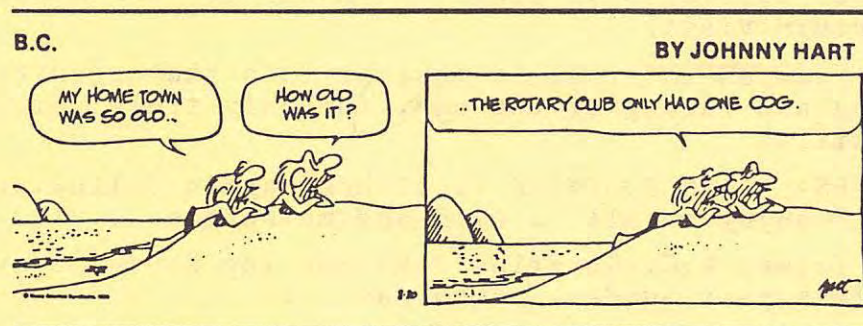
