





The fee comes to \$11.54 per meeting, assuming 13 meetings a quarter and includes a full meal. Anyone missing a meeting and providing a make-up card within a reasonable time will receive a credit of \$12.50 in the following quarter. This is based on the accountants' inability to calculate anything other than 12 weeks in a fiscal quarter and their inability to deal with anything beyond the decimal point that does not end in a zero.

<u>Insurance</u>: Interns are covered by HTH liability insurance while on-site or participating in any activity related to their internship.

<u>Pay:</u> Unpaid. Program is academic in nature. Interns may be paid after internship hours/after school, or in the summer at mentor's discretion. Donations are accepted to the program for transportation and other expense.

<u>Iransportation:</u> Provided (either by the students own car, a HTH shuttle, mass transit, or parent).

### **Academic Internship Goals**

- The goals of High Tech High's Academic Internship program are to provide students
  with workplace skills, through project-based learning in a real-world environment.
  Additionally, the program is designed to provide local organizations with a well
  supported intern who provides a modest return on investment.
- All High Tech High students in their Junior year are required to complete an academic
  internship to graduate. Students receive a grade for the successfully completing their
  internship along with course work related to their internship. Students are required to
  put together a project surrounding their internship, write journals, and communicate
  with their employers, mentors and the school internship coordinator.

### **Structure**

- Semester long: Students work at their internships on Tuesday and Thursdays, from about 1:00 pm to 4:30 pm.
- Each student is paired with a caring and motivated mentor who understands and supports HTH and its philosophies.
- A project is planned for the student. Some projects last an entire semester; others are short projects which give the student an opportunity to work on several things throughout the semester. - HTH students work on projects that range from event and marketing support projects, web design projects, recruitment and retention projects with HR department, networking, software and hardware support, public relations support positions which included presentations in public forums and in the community.





## Redwood City Rotary Club Installation and Debunking

John just back from another trip.

OK, everyone ready? Do we have a budget?
