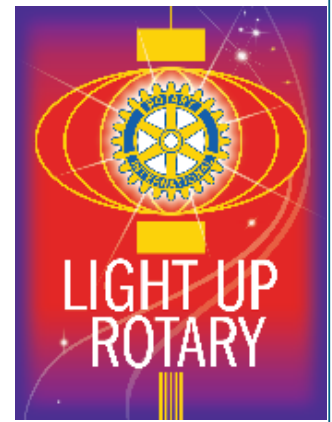

JOIN ROTARY, SEE THE WORLD

November 2014 offers an excellent opportunity to be part of the international aspect of Rotary.

Rotary District 4400, Ecuador, is holding their tenth Project Fair. The **Rotary Project Fair** to be held at the Dann Carlton Hotel in **Quito, Ecuador on Friday 14th, Saturday 15th, and Sunday 16th, November, 2014. City Tour on November 13, 2014 included.**

A project fair is a Rotary program which enables Clubs to find international partners for developing humanitarian projects financed with Global Grants or small club grants. In this three-day Rotarian encounter, Ecuadorean clubs will exhibit their projects to visiting Rotarians, who will learn about them and, if interested, then reach agreements of joint work.

Clubs from District 4400 will be offering around 80 projects of various sizes. The fair is also useful for foreign clubs to offer their projects to local clubs and establish working agreements.

The registration fee of US\$ 180 per person includes a guided tour to the Historical Center of Quito on November 13, lunches during the 3 days of the Fair, coffee breaks, social gatherings and transportation to events associated with the Project Fair. Lodging at the Dann Carlton Hotel is US\$ 128.10 in a single room and US\$140.30 in double room, incl. taxes, per day. Registration and information are at www.rotaryecuador.org.

Non-Rotarians who do not wish to attend the Project Fair can pay \$65 to join the city tour and Friday night event.

You need to bring cash to pay this registration fee since the Rotarians are not set up to accept a credit card

The Ecuadorian Rotarians have also arranged for post-Project Fair excursions to beautiful parts of their country. These excursions are at reasonable prices and include **Galapagos Islands, Amazonian jungle, the Andean Sierra** with a visit to Otavalo, Cuenca, and other beautiful cities or a tour to **Guayaquil following the Coastal Sun Route.**

Holly Axtell, District 5150, is organizing a **pre-trip** to the northwest corner of Ecuador, Esmeraldas, to visit the most recent Rotary microcredit project. As of August 2014, there were still a few spaces available. This trip will leave from and return to Quito. Travelers have to arrive at the Quito airport by Saturday, November 8, 2014.

We will spend the night at a small hotel relatively near the airport and fly to Esmeraldas as a group. Our trip then includes three nights of hotel (also small hotel) on the beach in Esmeraldas and bus transportation to go north to Rio Verde on Monday and Tuesday to meet the people participating in the microcredit project, see their businesses, and visit the new training center that Rotary is sponsoring. On November 12 we fly as a group back to Quito and will be taken from the airport to the Hotel Dann Carlton for the Project Fair.

Cost is around \$800 for single and \$1300 for two including hotels, airfare and bus transportation.

Guzman will serve 4000 people with free, safe drinking water every day for the next 10 years, saving them over \$1 million dollars in bottled water purchases each year. 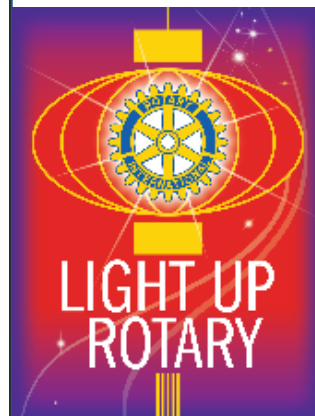

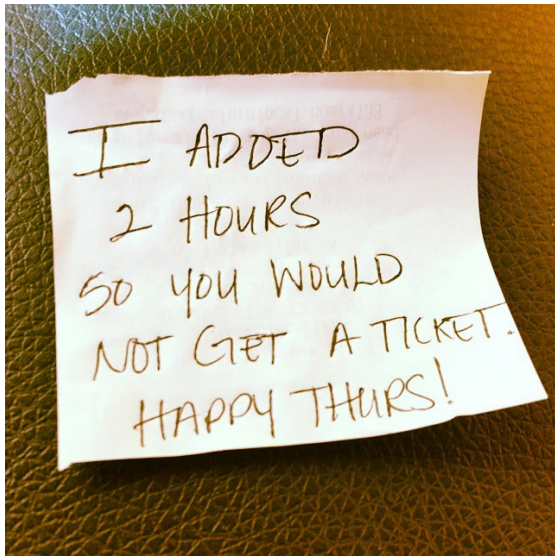

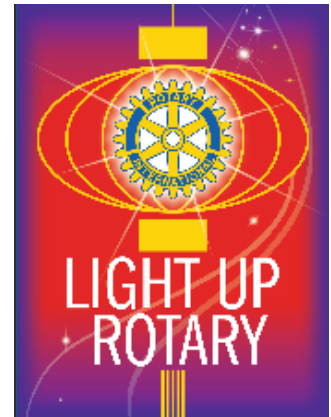
This Week's Program - Herman Lukwago

She wrote: My name is Annie Ashmore, and my grandpa, Dr. Paul Young, is a Rotarian in your club. I recently returned from a six week trip to Uganda, where I attended the Rotary Club of Rubaga as a guest during my entire stay. My host dad in Uganda is a Rotarian named Herman Lukwago, and he embodies the Rotary motto of "service above self" in so many ways. 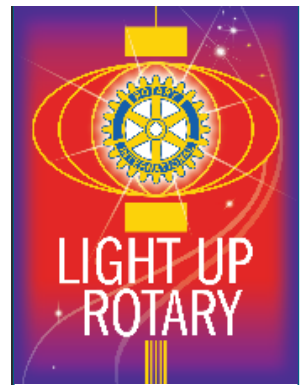

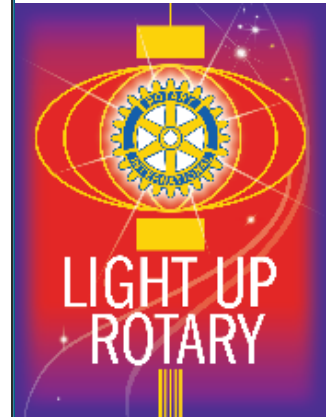
