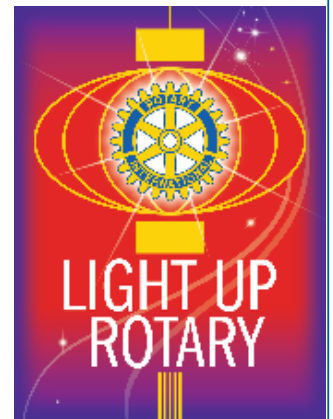

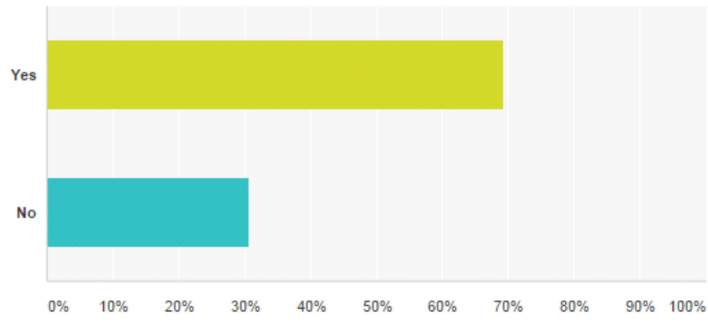

**This Week's Program - - History of the 18th Century Brig Lady Washington**

Our speaker, Capt. Scott Schwartz, crew of the Sailing Vessel Lady Washington will present a history of the 18th Century Brig Lady Washington. He will discuss a brief history of what it was like being a sailor during



the revolutionary war; and will discuss Gray's Harbor efforts to teach grade school and at risk children the ways of tall ships!

## Next week's program:

### The Wall that Heals (Keith Blackley)

This presentation will be on the Wall that Heals that will be on display at the Golden Gate National Cemetery in April of 2015. Keith Blackley is coordinating the visit from the wall and will be our speaker today.

Though Keith's father was a career Army officer, his childhood dream was to fly Navy but didn't qualify to be a pilot because he wore glasses. Knowing he would be drafted, he begrudgingly joined the Army. Fatefully, he was assigned to a Navy squadron after Army training and though not a pilot, he lived his dream of flying during the Vietnam War era.

Keith is a veteran of four wars over the last 49 years (two in military uniform and two in Scout uniform), a 21-year volunteer at the Menlo Park Veterans Hospital PTSD clinic, and member of American Legion, AMVETS, VFW, and Vietnam Veterans of America.

Keith holds a Bachelors degree in Electrical Engineering and Executive Masters in Business Administration. He has been a global sales and marketing executive for several Silicon Valley companies including Fairchild and Hewlett-Packard and was Marketing VP of one of the fastest growing Internet companies in Peoples Republic of China.

In addition to his combat experience, Keith has been helping rebuild war-torn countries through their Girl and Boy Scout programs for ten years. He assisted with the Iraqi Scout program that grew from eight Scouts in 2004 to 150,000 Girl and Boy Scouts in 2010 and he recently returned from 18 months of living and working in Afghanistan as an adviser to the Afghan Girl and Boy Scout program. 2015 is Keith's 63rd year in Scouting.

Keith is a founding member of the Rotary Club of Kabul City.

Keith's talk is titled "Kicking off the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War with the Bay Area's largest patriotic event". *The Wall That Heals* exhibition features a half-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C.

It is approximately 250 feet in length, and like the original Memorial is erected in a chevron-shape. The replica is constructed of powder-coated aluminum, supported by an aluminum frame, and is made up of 24 individual panels

As on The Wall, the names on *The Wall That Heals* are listed by day of casualty. Beginning at the center/apex, the names start on the East Wall (right-hand side) working their way out to the end of that wing, picking up again at the far end of the West Wall (left-hand side) and working their way back in to the center/apex, joining the beginning and end of the conflict at the center.

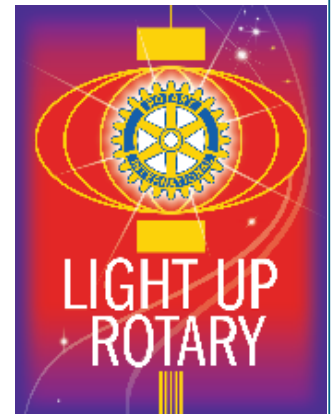

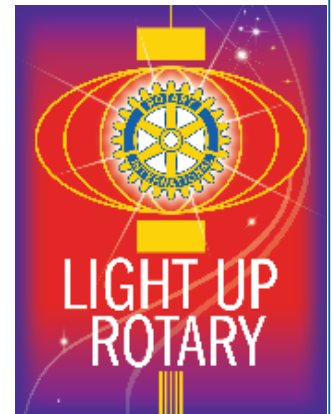
